Rights Respecting Schools

At our school we use positive behaviour management to encourage and reward children for making the right choices in their behaviour. This is based on the values of our school which are respect, co-operation, equality, honesty & responsibility.

Alloway is a Gold Rights Respecting School and our class charters underpin behaviour management in classrooms. These charters are created and agreed by the children.

Our class charter is - In P6G we understand that we all have rights and responsibilities that go hand in hand to make our school a safe, fair and successful place to learn. Together as a class, we discussed the UNCRC and agreed on the rights we would focus on this year to help us grow, work hard and enjoy our learning. As rights holders, the children are responsible for respecting these rights for themselves and others. As the duty bearer, I have the responsibility to make sure these rights are protected and upheld every day in school. To make our class charter unique, we decided to show our learning through the theme of Roblox, linking the world of creativity and teamwork in the game to the way we will work and learn together in P6G.

Rewards for Positive Behaviour

- Positive recognition for making the correct choices will be given through verbal praise in class and around the school.
- Individual and group points are given in class.
- House Points are given in class and throughout the school.
- Stickers and Certificates are given to pupils as rewards.
- Mrs Meney and Mrs Miller love it when children visit their office to share good news and achievements.

Disrespectful Behaviour

Children are rewarded for making positive choices and showing respect however if disrespectful behaviour continues, teachers will take appropriate action. This may include individual chats to support pupils, contacting parents and informing senior management in order to support children in making the right choices. We want to work together with parents to help support children's behaviour.

Uniform

Children should wear school uniform. This helps us identify as part of Alloway Primary School. Please name all uniform so it can be easily identified if it gets lost. Please also bring a jacket to school. We will be going outside for outdoor learning and loose parts play. Children can leave a waterproof on their coat peg if they wish.

Homework

Last session we asked parents about homework. We made some changes but will review this again at the start of the session with children, parents and staff. More information will follow.

Absence

We fully support the South Ayrshire Council campaign called 'Every learner, every day' and will work hard to support children to improve individual attendance. Research has proven that good attendance links directly to attainment. Mrs Park our Principal Teacher will be supporting children and families with this.
