## Fresh Start

This term, our core work will focus on place value, estimating, and rounding numbers up to 1000. We will also explore 2D and 3D shapes, looking at symmetry and patterns.



# <u>Literacy</u>

We are developing our reading and spelling skills using South Ayrshire Reads strategies. Through the alphabetic code and decodable texts, we aim to support confident and motivated readers with a solid understanding of sounds. We use active literacy approaches, including decoding (reading), encoding (writing), comprehension, grammar, and spelling.

The reading book your child brings home will have been prepared and studied in class the previous week, so they should be able to read and discuss it with you. Books can be returned on Friday.



In class, we will be reading the classic novel Mr. Majeika by Humphrey Carpenter as a whole-class text. We will explore the story together, making predictions, examining characterisation, and appreciating the rich and engaging language used throughout the book.

In grammar, we will focus on parts of speech, including nouns, verbs, and adjectives. This will help us expand our vocabulary and support our exciting story writing.

# Expressive Arts

In art, we are observing and recording across the curriculum, creating detailed drawings such as characters from *Mr. Majeika*, self-portraits, and illustrations inspired by our literacy work. We are developing and presenting work that shows growing skill in using the visual elements of line, shape, form, colour, tone, pattern, and texture.

.In music, we enjoy singing games, rhymes, and songs together, focusing on phrasing and breath control. We also play instruments to explore and enjoy sound, rhythm, pitch, and dynamics. Using glockenspiels, we will learn to follow musical notation and perform simple pieces. Our art and music learning links to Articles 29 and 31 of the UNCRC, supporting children's development, creativity, and cultural understanding.
