Our class is P4S.

Rights Respecting Schools

At our school we use positive behaviour management to encourage and reward children for making the right choices in their behaviour. This is based on the values of our school which are respect, co-operation, equality, honesty & responsibility.

Alloway is a Gold Rights Respecting School, and our class charters underpin behaviour management in classrooms. These charters are created and agreed by the children.

Our class charter is -

Article	Rights holders (children) will:	Duty bearers (adults) will:
Article 28 Every child has the right to learn at school.	Children will respectfully listen to teacher and peers in their classroom. They will show kindness by always encouraging and helping each other. They will make sure that everyone is included during group work. Ensure that all children in our classroom feel included. Be aware and supportive of all needs.	Speak clearly and concisely during teacher time. Making sure not to talk too long and allow children to be active in their learning. Use attention strategies to get attention when children are busy, and information needs to be passed to them about learning. Ensure children abide by the rule of always showing respect to others.
Article 12 Every child has the right to be heard.	Be encouraged to take part in whole class and group discussions. Offering their opinion respectfully and listening to the opinions of others before entering debate.	Listen to the views of children when it comes to what they want to learn and engage with. Where possible work with the children to learn in their chosen way or explore their chosen subject.
Article 31 Every child has the right to play.	Ensure that all children in our classroom feel included. Be aware and supportive of all needs. All children can make friends by having fun lessons planned that encourage collaborative learning.	Make sure that all children can have quiet time and relax when needed. This supports the pupil's emotional regulation as well as we ensure that pupils get time to have brain breaks and time to relax during lunch and break
Article 19 Every child has the right to be safe.	Make sure chairs are tucked in properly - so no one trips over them. Keep areas within our classroom tidy again to reduce accidents happening. Make sure Miss Saunders doesn't forget the medbox. Follow instructions around movement within the classroom.	Give children plenty of time from tidying up. Ensure they are following rules of keeping chairs tucked in when not seated. Make sure all are listening before we move around the classroom and school. Always remind children of the rules. Offer helpful strategies for self-regulation if a child's zones are off.

Rewards for Positive Behaviour

- Positive recognition for making the correct choices will be given through verbal praise in class and around the school.
- Individual and group points are given in class.
- House Points are given in class and throughout the school.
- Stickers and Certificates are given to pupils as rewards.

- Praise notes sent home to show parents how well pupils are doing.
- Mrs Meney and Mrs Miller love it when children visit their office to share good news and achievements.

Disrespectful Behaviour

Children are rewarded for making positive choices and showing respect however if disrespectful behaviour continues, teachers will take appropriate action. This may include individual chats to support pupils, contacting parents and informing senior management in order to support children in making the right choices. We want to work together with parents to help support children's behaviour.

Uniform

Children should wear school uniform. This helps us identify as part of Alloway Primary School. Please name all uniform so it can be easily identified if it gets lost. Please also bring a jacket to school. We will be going outside for outdoor learning and loose parts play. Children can leave a waterproof on their coat peg if they wish.
