At our school we use positive behaviour management to encourage and reward children for making the right choices in their behaviour. This is based on the values of our school which are respect, co-operation, equality, honesty & responsibility. Alloway is a Gold Rights Respecting School and our class charters underpin behaviour management in classrooms. These charters are created and agreed by the children.

Positive Relationship Policy

This session we will be reviewing our Positive Relationship Policy. We want our school values to underpin this policy. Children are learning and can make mistakes. We will work together to ensure children get the best start in life.

Rewards for Positive Behaviour

- Positive recognition for making the correct choices will be given through verbal praise in class and around the school.
- Individual and group points are given in class.
- House Points are given in class and throughout the school.
- Stickers and Certificates are given to pupils as rewards.
- Mrs Meney and Mrs Miller love it when children visit their office to share good news and achievements.

Disrespectful Behaviour

Children are rewarded for making positive choices and showing respect however if disrespectful behaviour continues, teachers will take appropriate action. This may include individual chats to support pupils, contacting parents and informing senior management in order to support children in making the right choices. We want to work together with parents to help support children's behaviour.

Please note holidays during term time are not given as an authorised absence.	will be used to share class stories and learning. Teachers will post pictures and information about what the class is doing. This is a good opportunity to share learning with you. We aim to have this set up soon and will share details with you when this is ready to go.
<u>Sharing our targets</u> Children will set learning targets with their teacher. This session children will have an online profile on Seesaw where they record progress with their targets and share work that they are proud of. They will share this with you across the terms.	<u>Uniform</u> Children should wear school uniform. This helps us identify as part of Alloway Primary School. Please name all uniform so it can be easily identified if it gets lost. Please also bring a jacket to school. We will be going outside for outdoor learning and loose parts play. Children can leave a waterproof on their coat peg if they wish.
<u>Contacting the class teacher</u> Should you wish to contact the class teacher we would ask you to phone into the school office to request a phonecall back from the teacher at an arranged time or email into the school mailbox and the message will be passed to the class teacher. We would ask that parents do not email directly into teacher's inboxes. The booklet will contain: • A clear list of the homework tasks to be completed each week • Any resources or guidance needed to help children complete the activities Children should work through the activities over the course of the term, completing the tasks assigned for each week. Homework jotters should be returned to school every Friday so that teachers can monitor progress and provide support where needed.
