School Vision and Values

At our school we use positive behaviour management to encourage and reward children for making the right choices in their behaviour. This is based on the values of our school which are respect, co-operation, equality, honesty & responsibility. Alloway is a Gold Rights Respecting School and our class charters underpin behaviour management in classrooms. These charters are created and agreed by the children.

Our class charter is -

Article 2 - The right to be treated fairly.	Adults (duty bearers) respect this right by treating everyone fairly and not discriminating against anyone.	Children (rights holders) respect this right by treating everyone fairly, showing respect to everyone and trying to be inclusive.
Article 16 -The right to privacy.	Adults (duty bearers) respect this right by speaking to us privately and allowing us to get changed in the changing rooms for PE.	Children (rights holders) respect this right by allowing others privacy and giving people personal space to ensure they feel safe.
Article 27 - The right to food, clothing and having our basic needs met.	Adults (duty bearers) respect this right by making sure we have access to a nutritious lunch and fresh drinking water.	Children (rights holders) respect this right by eating the lunch provided for us and trusting the adults to take care of us.
Article 28 - The right to education.	Adults (duty bearers) respect this right by planning and preparing lessons and explaining things clearly to us.	Children (rights holders) respect this right by listening carefully, trying our best and not distracting others.
Article 31 - The right to rest and play.	Adults (duty bearers) respect this right by taking us outside to play at break and lunch.	Children (rights holders) respect this right by following the playground charter to ensure everyone is able to enjoy their rest and play.

Positive Relationship Policy

This session we will be reviewing our Positive Relationship Policy. We want our school values to underpin this policy. Children are learning and can make mistakes. We will work together to ensure children get the best start in life.

Rewards for Positive Behaviour

- Positive recognition for making the correct choices will be given through verbal praise in class and around the school.
- Individual and group points are given in class.
- House Points are given in class and throughout the school.
- Stickers and Certificates are given to pupils as rewards.
- Mrs Meney and Mrs Miller love it when children visit their office to share good news and achievements.

Disrespectful Behaviour

Children are rewarded for making positive choices and showing respect however if disrespectful behaviour continues, teachers will take appropriate action. This may include individual chats to support pupils, contacting parents and informing senior management in order to support children in making the right choices. We want to work together with parents to help support children's behaviour.

<u>Absence</u> We fully support the South Ayrshire Council campaign called 'Every learner, every day' and will work hard to support children to improve individual attendance. Research has proven that good attendance links directly to attainment. Mrs Park our Principal Teacher will be supporting children and families with this. Every Learner Every Day Video Any absence must be reported by 9.30am to the school office either by phone call or by using the ParentsPortal app. Please do not report absence via Seesaw. Please note holidays during term time are not given as an authorised absence.	<u>Seesaw</u> This session we will be using the Seesaw app to share learning that happens in the class. We will be using this instead of Learning Journals as it is more user friendly. This is a new version of the Seesaw app which is GDPR compliant. This will become our online profile which children will add to. The Seesaw app will be used to share class stories and learning. Teachers will post pictures and information about what the class is doing. This is a good opportunity to share learning with you. We aim to have this set up soon and will share details with you when this is ready to go.
<u>Sharing our targets</u> Children will set learning targets with their teacher. This session children will have an online profile on Seesaw where they record progress with their targets and share work that they are proud of. They will share this with you across the terms.	<u>Uniform</u> Children should wear school uniform. This helps us identify as part of Alloway Primary School. Please name all uniform so it can be easily identified if it gets lost. Please also bring a jacket to school. We will be going outside for outdoor learning and loose parts play. Children can leave a waterproof on their coat peg if they wish.
<u>Contacting the class teacher</u> Should you wish to contact the class teacher we would ask you to phone into the school office to request a phonecall back from the teacher at an arranged time or email into the school mailbox and the message will be passed to the class teacher. We would ask that parents do not email directly into teacher's inboxes. Our school mailbox is - alloway.mail@south-ayrshire.gov.uk This is monitored daily by office staff.	<u>Homework</u> Each week, pupils will receive spelling and numeracy homework. Their spelling homework aims to reinforce the phoneme focused on in class that week. They will receive a decodable text with a follow up task to complete. For numeracy, pupils will receive a SAFE challenge to consolidate beyond number skills.

	Due to the nature of P7, pupils will occasionally receive additional homework in preparation for any special events or learning taking place.
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We want to work closely with our parents and carers this year. We look forward to the session ahead and can't wait to share your child's experiences with you.
