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Easter Cream Egg Truffles



Ingredients

- •10 mini creme eggs, unwrapped
- •4 tbsp cream cheese
- •3 tbsp icing sugar, sifted
- •150g all-butter shortbread biscuits, crushed into crumbs
- •150g milk chocolate, melted
- •1 tsp vanilla extract
- •150g sprinkles choose your favourites like chocolate sprinkles or funfetti

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Method

- 1. Mix together the cream cheese and icing sugar in a large bowl. Add the shortbread crumbs, melted chocolate, vanilla extract and mix until combined this should be a stiff mixture you can now shape.
- 2. Take a heaped tablespoon of the mixture and roll into a ball, flatten out and place a creme egg in the middle. Wrap the mixture around the creme egg and roll into a ball shape. Roll in the sprinkles and place on a plate.
- 3. Repeat with the remaining creme eggs and mixture. Refrigerate for 1 hour 30 mins before serving. Enjoy!

Study Tip of the Week

Attend Supported Study and Easter School

Studies completed by the Quality in Education Care department, University of Strathclyde, show that supported study makes a difference. The research found firm evidence in all the schools studied, that pupils who participate in study support do better than would have been expected from baseline measures in academic attainment, attitudes to school and attendance at school.

Study support can improve attainment in Maths and English by half a grade.

Ayr Academy offers an extensive supported study programme throughout the session, which is in addition to individual teacher's open door policy.

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

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
