Dear Parents/ Carers,

We have been planning for the children to return from Wednesday 12th August. Following this letter you will receive an email letting you know the days your child is in from August and who their teacher will be. A **Guide for Families** explaining the measures in place to keep everyone safe and how learning part time in school and part time at home will work, is attached.

We are operating a two day rotation with approximately half the children in school on and Monday and Tuesday starting 17th August and the other half of the children in on Thursday and Friday starting 20th August. The Wednesday will be used for teachers to plan home and school learning, support Teams/ Seesaw, have teacher non contact time and provide time for deep cleaning. Some children may have additional teaching time on a Wednesday and the school may also be providing childcare for key workers.

As children have spent a considerable amount of time away from the school environment, we have planned transition days for Wednesday 12th August, Thursday 13th August and Friday 14th August, with the two day rotation starting on Monday 17th August as outlined above. Wednesday 12th August: EYC and Primary One children only (times will be included in your email) **Thursday 13th August:** Children in Group A EYC-P7 (Monday and Tuesday following staggered entry and exit)

Friday 14th **August:** Children in Group B EYC-P7 (Thursday and Friday following staggered entry and exit)

I wish our current P7 pupils all the very best as they move onto Marr College and assure new families in Primary One and the Early Years Centre of a warm welcome to Barassie Primary from the staff team here.
