

Come and join your child in class for a learning together session and see what they have been learning about in school. There will be an opportunity to look at your child's work and to engage in activities together in class.



We require all parents/carers to sign up to Parents Portal. The annual data check and consents are now completed via this system.

We cannot take children out of the school without their annual consent being completed and would ask that this is completed at your earliest convenience.

Free School Meal and Clothing Grants

Free School Meal/Clothing Grant applications for 2024/25 are available here - : <u>Educational grants - South Ayrshire Council (south-ayrshire.gov.uk)</u>

The Scottish Government have committed to providing a free school meal to all P1 to P5 pupils, however we are requesting that parents/carers who meet the eligibility criteria submit an application as this information will be used to pay free school meal payments during school holiday periods.

Please note that Clothing Grant eligibility criteria is now in line with the Criteria for Free School Meals. Information can be found using the link above.

If you need help with your application, you can call 0300 123 0900 to speak to a customer service advisor.

Children in P6 and P7 are charged 35p for milk.

Please note that applications need to be completed each school year and do not automatically continue.

You must apply each year.

School Car Park

Please refrain from using the school and EYC car parks for dropping off and collecting children at the start and end of the school day.

School and EYC car parks are strictly for staff, blue badge holders and visitors.

Thank you for helping keep all children safe on their way to and from school.
