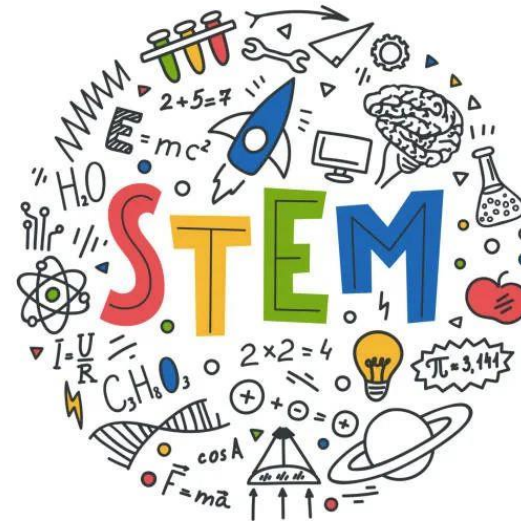
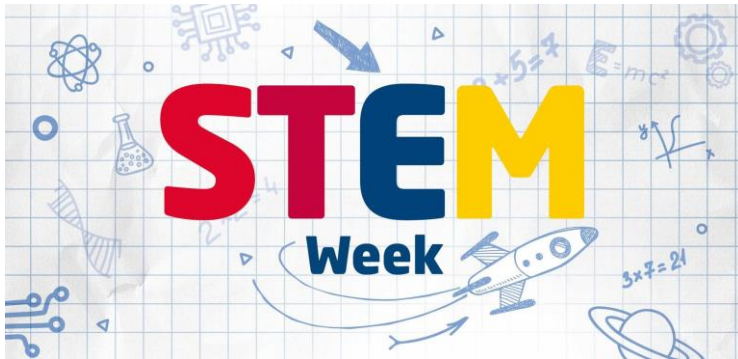

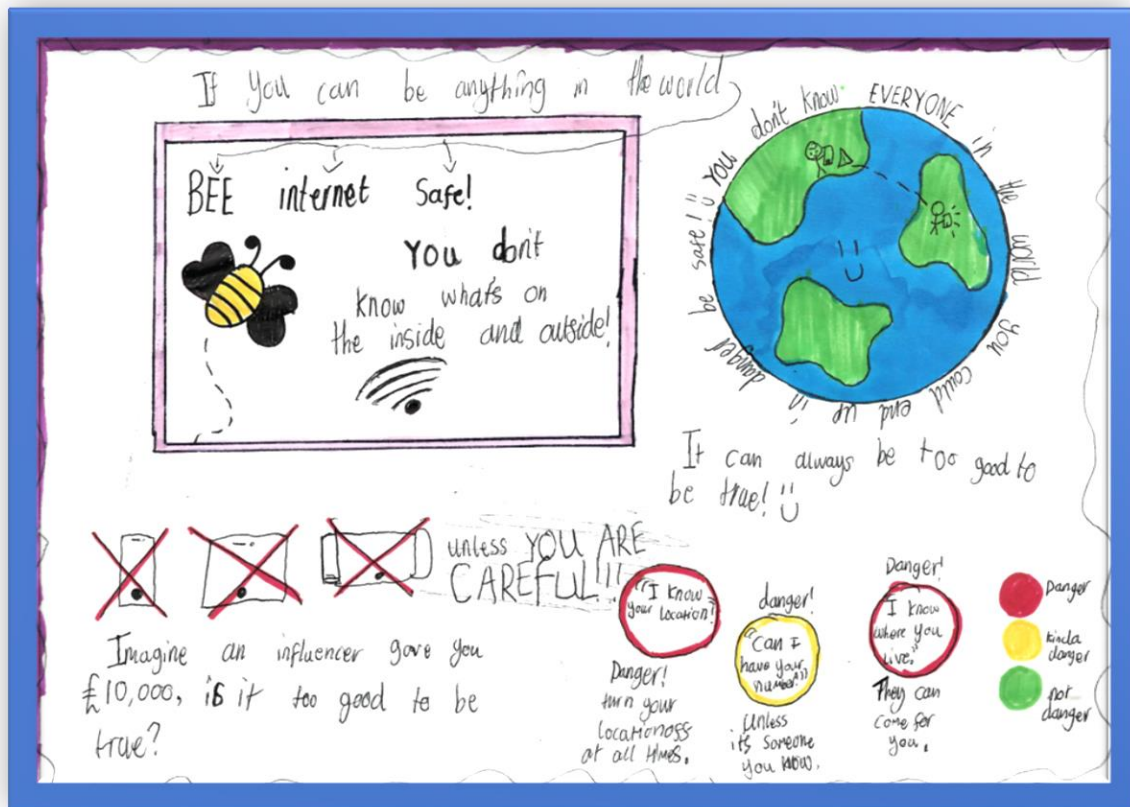

P7 Marr Transition Science Project

Introduction

P7 have been tasked with making the school more sustainable as part of a transition science project with Marr College. Our aim is to reduce single use plastic at Barassie Primary School. Our focus will be reusable water bottles and/ or cups and reusable tupperware in packed lunches.



What We Think Would Help:

We think that if we do a daily reusable water bottle survey in each class and have a winning class each week this would encourage reduction of single use plastic. We will also be setting up a donation station for water bottles, cups and tupperware this aims to reduce plastic waste in packed lunch boxes. We are also making beeswax paper for reusable wrappings for the whole school!

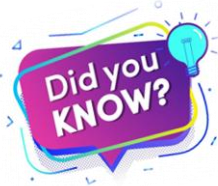

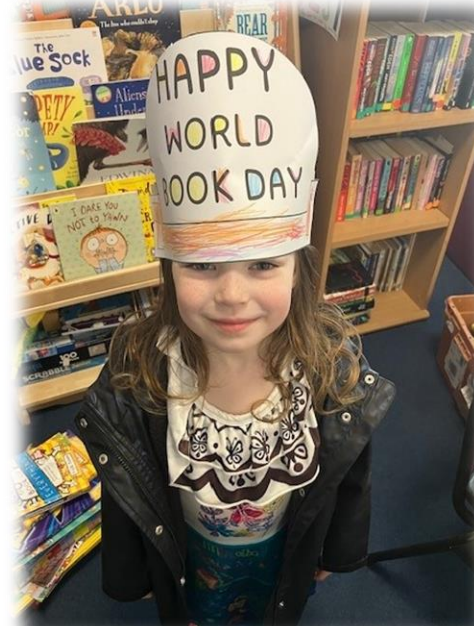

From 1st February 2025, the Scottish Government has added an additional qualifying criteria for access to free school meals. The change introduced is that families with pupils in P6 or P7 who are in receipt of the Scottish Child Payment can now apply.

Free School Meal and Clothing Grants

Free School Meal/Clothing Grant applications for 2024/25 are available here - : [Educational grants - South Ayrshire Council \(south-ayrshire.gov.uk\)](https://www.south-ayrshire.gov.uk/educational-grants)

The Scottish Government have committed to providing a free school meal to all P1 to P5 pupils, however we are requesting that parents/carers who meet the eligibility criteria submit an application as this information will be used to pay free school meal payments during school holiday periods.

Please note that Clothing Grant eligibility criteria is now in line with the Criteria for Free School Meals. Information can be found using the link above.

If you need help with your application, you can call 0300 123 0900 to speak to a customer service advisor.

Children in P6 and P7 are charged 35p for milk.

Please note that applications need to be completed each school year and do not automatically continue.

You must apply each year.

School Car Park

Please refrain from using the school and EYC car parks for dropping off and collecting children at the start and end of the school day.

School and EYC car parks are strictly for staff, blue badge holders and visitors.
