We have lots of exciting events coming up this term. Details of some of these can be found in this update.







Activities include; chat, company, new connections, crafts, aromatherapy, health, music, cooking, baking, guest speakers, support, bingo and more.


THRIVING COMMUNITIES

Free School Meal and Clothing Grants

Free School Meal/Clothing Grant applications for 2025/26 are available here - : <u>Educational grants - South Ayrshire Council (south-ayrshire.gov.uk)</u>

The Scottish Government have committed to providing a free school meal to all P1 to P5 pupils, however we are requesting that parents/carers who meet the eligibility criteria submit an application as this information will be used to pay free school meal payments during school holiday periods.

Please note that Clothing Grant eligibility criteria is now in line with the Criteria for Free School Meals. Information can be found using the link above.

If you need help with your application, you can call 0300 123 0900 to speak to a customer service advisor.

Children in P6 and P7 are charged 35p for milk.

Please note that applications need to be completed each school year and do not automatically continue.

You must apply each year.

School Car Park

Please refrain from using the school and EYC car parks for dropping off and collecting children at the start and end of the school day.

School and EYC car parks are strictly for staff, blue badge holders and visitors.

Thank you for helping keep all children safe on their way to and from school.

Please inform the office of any changes to telephone numbers, home addresses or email addresses to ensure you can be contacted and to receive regular communication from us.

Day to day communication with class teachers will take place through Seesaw (once this is up and running). Teachers will respond at appropriate times to messages but please be aware these are not monitored out with working hours and be mindful that teachers are most likely teaching the class for large parts of the school day.


Information about absences, meeting/telephone requests or appointments should continue to be reported to the school office.
