Following on from 'Little Red Riding Hood' the focus for our Talk for Writing this term is learning to write instructions. P1-4 were excited when they discovered a number of WANTED posters displayed in and around the school. They were given the challenge of creating a trap to catch the Big Bad Wolf. They searched frantically to find him and created a huge poster to entice the wolf to the food they had left in the trap. This tested their patience! But they were amazed that their poster and trap had worked. THEY CAUGHT THE BIG BAD WOLF and even heard him howl in his efforts to get free.

This hook has really engaged the children and made learning fun! They have now been introduced to a text map to learn how to write instruction of 'How to Catch the Big Bad Wolf' and identify the main features of instruction writing.





The children were very surprised to learn about the benefits of the Rainforest and they created super posters to encourage others to help save it.













P1-4 are really enjoying using the Early Years outdoor area to develop their learning.














Funky Fingers




Science


<u>Art</u>


