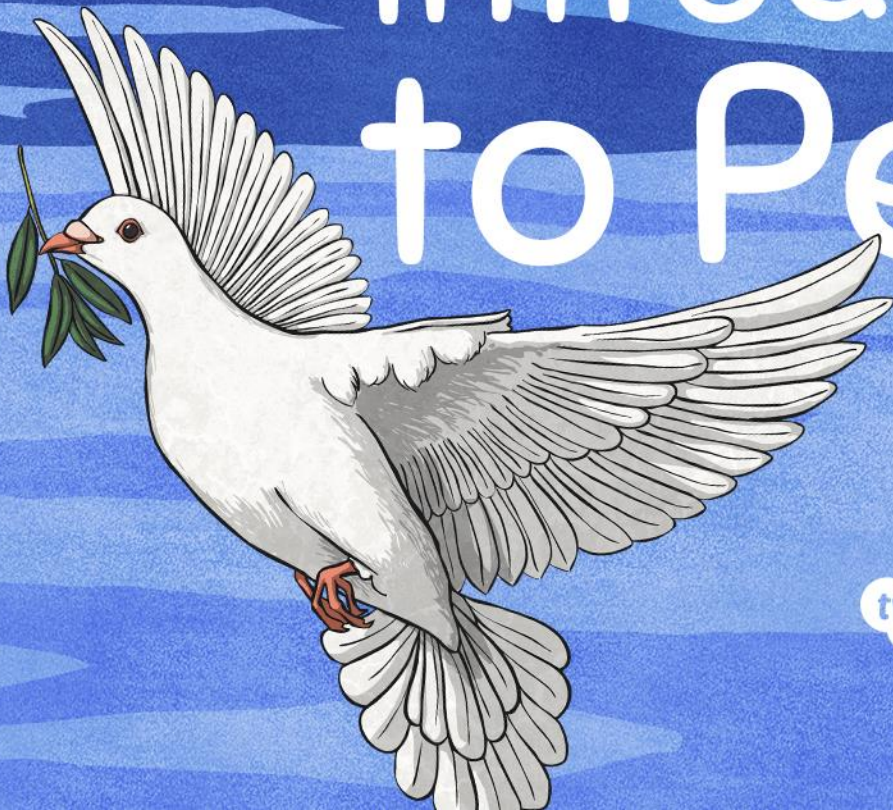

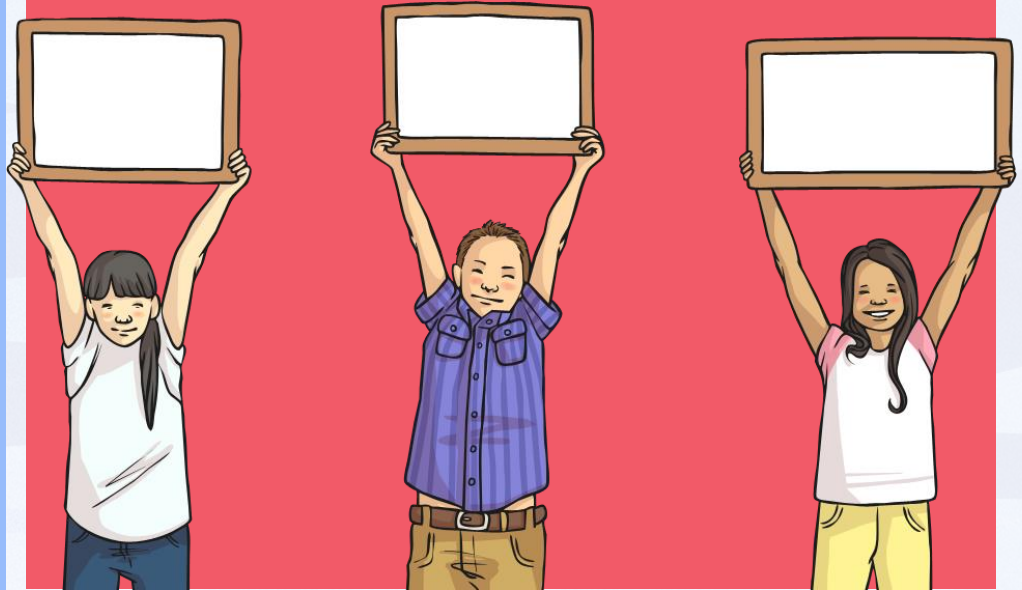
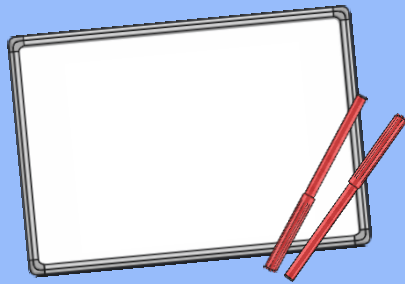

What Do We Mean by 'Peace'?



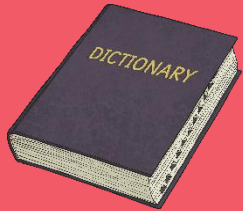
Write down all the things you think of when you hear the word 'peace'.

Definition



The oxford dictionary gives two definitions for the word 'peace'. These are:

A state or period in which there is no war or war has ended.
