

Help Mr Whoops with His Character Descriptions



These are the important things that I must remember if I want to write an excellent character description.

Remember to Use...

Paragraphs

Organise your character description using paragraphs. Whenever you start describing a different aspect (e.g. appearance, feelings, actions, etc.), use a new paragraph.

Apostrophes for Possession

Use an apostrophe to show possession if something belongs to your character, e.g. **Miss Cat's fur was a delightful shade of orange.**

Relative Clauses

Add extra information about your character using a relative clause. Try using **which, who, where, when, whose** or **that**.

Proofread

When you've finished writing, read through your work to check for any spelling and punctuation errors.

Ambitious Vocabulary

Try not to use the same words over and over again.

Can you think of exciting adjectives to describe your character?

Describe Your Character's Appearance and Personality

Tell your reader what your character looks like and what sort of person they are. Are they a humble, intelligent individual who always wants to help others?

Are they well dressed, selfish and rude?

Describe Your Character's Thoughts and Feelings

Tell your reader what your character is thinking and feeling. Is there something they're worried about? Are they always cheerful and smiling as if they do not have a care in the world?

Describe Your Character's Actions

Tell your reader how your character does things.

Are they always in a rush? Do they take their time and carefully consider everything they're doing?
