This challenge asks you to create your own garden that can float. Using what you have in your home or garden, can you create a garden that is able to float? Science: Bouncing egg Put an uncooked egg , shell and all, into a bowl or old jam jar. Pour vinegar into the jar, until it has covered the egg. Leave it for 24 hours and have a look at what is happening. What do you see? After 24 hours carefully take out the egg. What do you notice about it?
