What are the key features of Instructions?

"Y*Ties" elastic laces
Lacing Instructions:

REMOVE THOSE BORING OLD LACES!

- 1.** Lace "Y-Ties" through the bottom holes **REALLY LOOSE!**

Leave an extra curl for comfort.
Make sure they are centered.
- 2.** Lace them up **LOOSELY!!!**

(You can skip holes if you need to.)
- 3.** Untwist the curls between the holes.

Are they still **LOOSE?**
- 4.** Put your foot in and **HAVE FUN!!!**
You can hook the curls together

If they're still too tight, start over again. **Don't give up!**

Key features of Instructions

THEY USUALLY CONTAIN:

- A title
- A list of things that you will need.
- Numbered steps (Each step set out on a new line)
- A sequence of steps set out in the right order.
- Verbs which begin each instruction (put, get, spread, cut etc.)

Today we will be writing instructions which explain “How to make a sandwich”

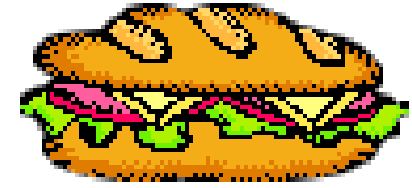


This is Angus the Alien. He only landed on earth this week and needs help doing the simplest of tasks.

We are learning to:

- Understand how to write and set out a clear, simple set of instructions.



What I'm Looking for:

You are to write a set of instructions for “How to make a sandwich” which include:

- A title
- A number for each instruction
- Each instruction beginning on a new line
- A verb or time connective word to begin each instruction
- All of the steps in the correct order.

- Traffic light cards to show me whether you need help or not!
