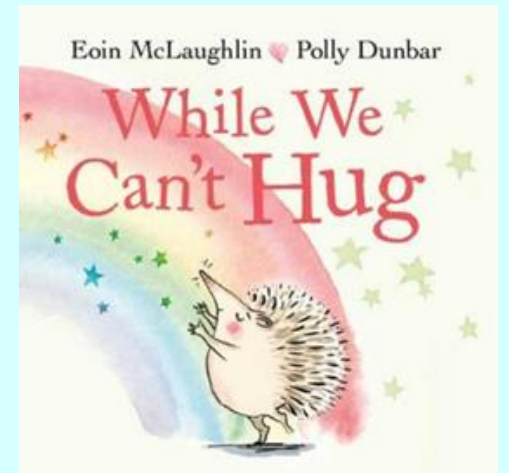

From

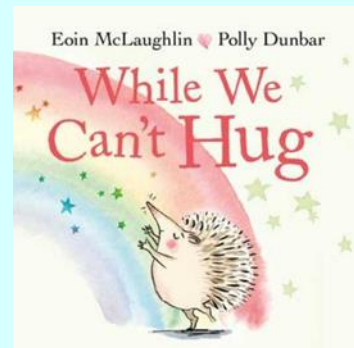
When you are finished ask your grown up to post it in the literacy channel on Teams.

If you can take a picture of the calculation you chose and post it on Teams under Numeracy.

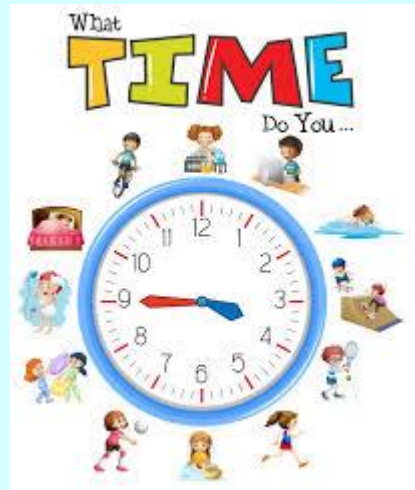
Time

Challenge: Can you find out how many minutes are in an hour?

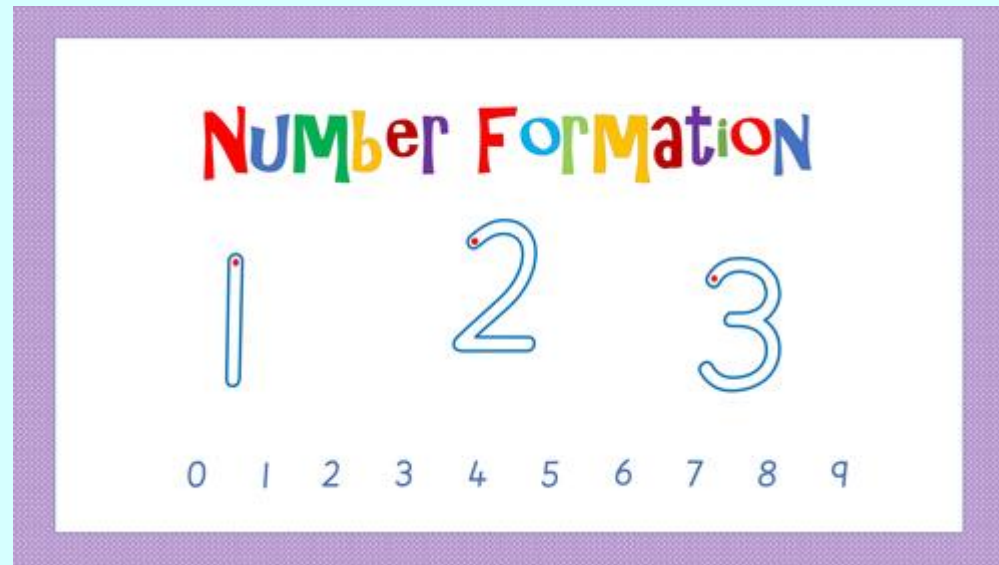


Number Formation

Write each number 4 times.

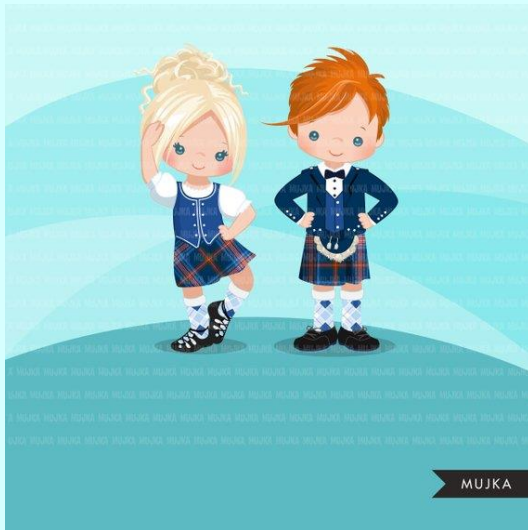
