Our Cluster Improvement Priority continues to focus on <u>Visual Arts</u> and we have some exciting work coming up with the children in the near future.

This bid also includes £600 towards the costs of a coach to take our children on an educational trip during the summer term. We are incredibly fortunate, as a school, that we don't have to charge parents for extracurricular opportunities and a huge thank you to everyone who helps us with school funding.
