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Literacy

- New spelling sound is 'oa'. Sing jolly phonics song for 'oa'. This can be found on YouTube. Practise writing words which contain the 'oa' sound- oak, oat, coat, boat. Can you think of any other words with this spelling pattern? Write them down. Create a poster with 'oa' spelling words. Watch Geraldine Giraffe on YouTube finding objects which contain 'oa' words.
- Everyday please practise your letter formation. Do this by using the Mr Crammond website. Click on the Language tab and then letter formation and finally letters of the alphabet. Practise writing each letter on a piece of paper.
- Draw a story map for The Gingerbread Man, or for a story of your choice. Remember your story map should be in the correct order. Can you add a title and date too?
