### Literacy

- Read your Accelerated Reader books as much as possible and quiz, quiz, quiz! To check any book levels of books you have at home please use [www.arbookfind.co.uk](http://www.arbookfind.co.uk). I will be checking to see who has been quizzing! Try to read for at least 15 – 20 minutes per day and fill in your booklet or keep a note of what you are reading. Let us all know which books you have been reading on teams!
- Try Epic! A digital library for children 12 and under offering access to over 40,000 high quality books. You can download the app and the code to join our class is raq7428 – Lets all get on Epic this week there are some fantastic books to be read.

### Grammar and Spelling

- Keep using Sumdog to practice Literacy every day. I have added new spelling words for you to work on this week! Try all the different games to learn your spelling words. Practice makes perfect. You can also find your new spelling words on P4 learning documents on teams or the school website there are also all new tasks in this document for you to complete.
- I have included some Grammar work this time on adverbs.

### Writing

- Finish the work on the Stone Trolls if you haven't already. This was a big piece of work and its okay to work through it slowly.
- The next writing challenge is instructions! A lot of you have been sharing some photos of your fantastic baking. Its time for you to try and write your own recipe. Try to watch a meal being prepared and write down the steps as you watch. This could be some baking or even a dinner. ### Comprehension

- As we are looking at recipes this fortnight your comprehension task will be on instructions and recipes. Find your task in the learning documents where you will find the text 'Cakes fit for a King' there will be questions to go with the text. ☺ (who can remember what an adverb is?)
- Can you complete the "End Plastic Pollution" comprehension? Read about different the different ways we can help reduce our use of plastic and answer the questions attached. As an extension exercise you can create an informative poster all about plastic pollution.

### Numeracy and Maths

- P4 will be able to access TopMarks [www.topmarks.co.uk](http://www.topmarks.co.uk) to continue to reinforce the learning noted in the last learning grid.
  - This week we should look at practicing times tables 2 through to 10. Use hit the button. Keep practicing. (If you feel confident try the 11 and 12 times table.)

  - Harder division questions (let me know how you get on!)

### Health and Wellbeing
