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Dear Parents and Carers



Hello, and welcome to another Friday Round Up!

Just a reminder that formal homework has now stopped. Children will benefit more during June from being outdoors. We would definitely continue to encourage children reading every day, whether on their own or with a family member.



The final couple of weeks of term are hugely important in our drive to improve school attendance across South Ayrshire schools. The most up to date data for South Ayrshire schools is as follows:

Sector	2022- 23	2023- 24
Primary	92.1%	92.83%
Secondary	85.3%	87.27%

In Coylton Primary and EYC, we are really pushing for children to attend school right up to the very last day of term. Learning is still taking place, as well as preparation for staff and pupils for the new session. You will see from the diary dates, classes still have events and activities to finalise and so please do send children to school until the 28th June! For information, have a look at the statistics below which outline the impact on attendance:

100% - 190 days in school.

95% - 10 days absent, which is 2 school weeks. 180 days in school.

90% - 19 days absent which is over 3 school weeks. 171 days in school.

85% - 29 days absent which is almost 6 school weeks. 161 days in school

80% - 38 days absent which is over 7 school weeks. 152 days in school

75% - 47 days absent which is a quarter of the school year. 143 days in school

Each term, our systems generate letters to go home to families where attendance slips below 90%. Over the summer, South Ayrshire Council will have a very visual presence on social media, radio and billboards with the catchphrase EVERY LEARNER, EVERY DAY! We therefore hope to see all our lovely pupils right up until 28th June, and every day in the new school session ©




We are very disappointed to report that we had a couple of items stolen from our bike storage area this week. We have a good number of children who either cycle or scoot to school, and they use our bike storage to keep bikes and scooters safe during the day. At times, items are left overnight and are not always secured to the railing. On Monday evening around 6:30pm, our CCTV picked up 2 young people coming into the storage area and leaving on 2 bikes, both of which were much too small for them. They cycled them out of the school playground. We are also aware that a small scooter had gone missing too. We were unable to identify the 2 young people. Since then, one of our pupils noticed the bikes dumped in the village and I am glad to say they have been reunited with their owners. The scooter has now also been located. We still very much encourage pupils to cycle and scoot, and to use our shelter, just ensure that they take the items home at the end of the day or secure them to the railings in the store.

We have been delighted to receive some additional features in our Outdoor Classroom recently as we are caretaking 3 beautiful carved statues, a huge table and some benches that were originally housed within the Community Garden. These items have really enhanced our area and the classes are thoroughly enjoying being up there working and learning. What is Parentsportal?

The traditional school bag run has been used to facilitate communication between parents and schools for generations. Parentsportal provides a digital solution to this issue, making it easier for parents and carers to manage paperwork connected with school activities, and to obtain information about their child's educational progress at a time that suits them. The priority, as we introduce Parentsportal, is to enable parents to sign in and complete the Annual Data Check online. We will then be working on introducing additional services to the platform during 202⁴.

Our school is now live on Parentsportal, and links have been sent out via Groupcall Xpressions on how to sign up. This will make such a difference all round when it comes to the Annual Data Checks as we won't be sending home all the paperwork – it's good for the environment too as we won't be using reams of paper of the photocopier. Please don't hesitate to contact the school office for more information. So far, we have 80% of families signed up, so please take a few minutes to link in.
