The children in the 2 year old room have had their first Play on Pedals session this week where they had an introduction to balancing and co-ordination. We will continue to develop their skills with weekly visits to the playground. We have also been exploring fireworks and the children have been talking about displays that they have saw at home. We watched a video of fireworks on YouTube and then explored different materials and mark making to create our own fireworks
