# Early Years Registration

Registration for Early Years in South Ayrshire opens on Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> March and closes on 9<sup>th</sup> March. South Ayrshire children have access to 1140 hours of funded early learning and childcare. Children who turn 3 between March – August 2025 are eligible to start in August 2025. Children who turn 3 between September 2025 - February 2026 are eligible to start the week after their 3rd birthday.
