Inspection of Coylton Primary and EYC

Thank you so much to those parents and carers in school and EYC who have already completed a survey ahead of our Education Scotland and Care Inspectorate inspection. The survey will close at some point today, and so if you haven't already done so, please look at the links that have been sent on Group Call last Friday and again on Wednesday.

Education Scotland will contact parents and Carers directly if you have volunteered to come in and speak with the team at Parent Focus Meetings. Pupils from Pt-7 have also completed surveys in school this week, and so have all staff and partners who work with us. The inspection team will engage with all staff and children, families, and partners to evaluate the areas that we are doing well in and to support us in ways that we could improve our service.

Following the inspection week, a letter of findings will be shared with all parents and carers as well as a more detailed report which will be published on the Education Scotland website.

Just a reminder, because of notification of Inspection, we will not be able to hold our planned Parent Appointments on Wednesday 19th November. The new date for this is WEDNESDAY 3RD DECEMBER. We will open the booking system for this on Monday 2th November.



Anti Bullying Week

Next week is Anti Bullying awareness week in schools. Our Pupil Council have already been active in raising awareness of this important topic is school by inviting all staff and pupils to complete an 'Odd Socks' sheet which will be entered into a competition. The theme for this year is *Power for Good* which empowers everyone to do something positive to counter the hurt and harm that bullying can cause. The Pupil Council will deliver lessons across all classes

in school and EYC throughout this week, and they invite everyone to wear ODD SOCKS on Friday 14th November.

Given that we are already asking for odd socks to be worn, we are happy to have a Dress Down day for Children in Need so uniform need not be worn next Friday. I am sure that they will lead the learning sensitively and with empathy. They have been selling poppies on behalf of Poppy Scotland for a few weeks now and all money will go directly to the charity. We will observe a minute of silence at Ilam on Tuesday morning.

At the start of term I, we informed parents that we were suspending homework tasks. This was as a result of the Parent Council Survey at the end of last session. It was a very low response, but even so, the results were almost split evenly with parents who wanted homework tasks and those who did not. Staff in school were spending a lot of time planning homework tasks to reflect the learning in class and were getting a very low percentage of classes completing it.
