Primary 1 Registration – Monday 12th January

Children who are 5 years old between 1st March 2026 and 28th February 2027 should be registered for education during the week commencing Monday 12th January 2026.

Parents/carers should register their children online at www.south-ayrshire.gov.uk/schools

The link will be available from Monday 12th January 2026 and all registrations should be completed by Sunday 18th January 2026.

When registering your child, you should attach their birth certificate and two items of proof of your residence in the catchment area, e.g. a Council Tax Notice, Utility Bill, etc.

Scottish Culture

Traditionally, January is the month in school where we celebrate all things Scottish. This year, all classes in school and EYC will do so through lessons, songs, dancing and fun! In addition, P1-7 classes will learn some Scots verse. There are 4 categories for Scots verse:

Children from every class can put themselves forward and 3 finalists will be selected for each category. Pupils have been issued with their poems and we encourage them to read them aloud as much as possible at home, as well as in school. Pupils do not need to put themselves forward if they don't want to.

The date for Scots Verse is Friday 30th January, starting at 9:30. We will inform parents of the finalists on Friday 23rd January. Parents are invited to come along to the event if they wish.

EYC and P1 classes are having a small Burns event on Wednesday 21st January. More information on this will come home soon.

Our P7 pupils will have their Burns Supper in school on Thursday 29th January (date change). P7 teachers will provide more information about this event via Teams.



Meta Skills Focus

This month, our whole-school Meta Skill focus is LEADING. Meta Skills are essential life skills that support children in all aspects of learning and life, helping them grow in confidence, resilience, and responsibility.

On Monday 12th January, our Primary 6 class will lead learning across the school, delivering a short lesson to each class to help pupils understand what it means to be a leader. This is a valuable opportunity for our P6 pupils to model positive leadership while encouraging all children to recognise that everyone can be a leader in different ways. We want children to understand that leadership can be shown through everyday actions and choices.

How you can support LEADING at home

- Give your child opportunities to take responsibility, such as helping organise family tasks or leading a game or activity.
- Encourage decision-making and talk about the outcomes of choices.
- Discuss examples of good leadership you notice at home, in the community, or in sport.
- Praise positive leadership behaviours such as helping others, including everyone, and showing empathy.

By working together, we can help our children develop strong leadership skills that will benefit them now and in the future.



Dolphin House Parent Meeting

We are getting very excited about our up coming residential trips to Dolphin House with P7. On Monday 12th January, members of the Dolphin House team will visit our P7 pupils to provide an outline of what to expect from the visit. They will meet with parents after school to allow them the chance to find out a bit more about the residential experience and to ask any relevant questions.



Communication

We are currently in the process of getting Microsoft Teams back up and running for all classes. Please look out for information in your child's school bag, which will include details of their username and password.

Microsoft Teams will allow class teachers to share information about class learning each month and will also be used to communicate important information such as PE days and Outdoor Learning days.

Please note that parents/carers should continue to use the usual communication methods to report absences. Whole-school events, Round Ups and messages will continue to be shared via Eduspot. This remains our main communication tool between parents/carers and the school, alongside Coylton Mail.

We appreciate that there are several platforms used for different purposes, and we hope the breakdown below provides clarity on what each one is used for:

- Eduspot – Our main communication platform for parents/carers. Used for whole-school messages, events, Round Ups, letters and important updates.
- Coylton Mail – Used for more detailed school communications sent directly to parents/carers.
- Parent Portal – Used to update and view your child's information, including emergency contacts, permissions and attendance-related information.
- ParentPay – Used for school payments such as lunches, trips and other school activities.

These achievements will be discussed and celebrated with your child in class and during House Assemblies. Photos will be added to our Wall of Fame which is displayed in the gym hall.

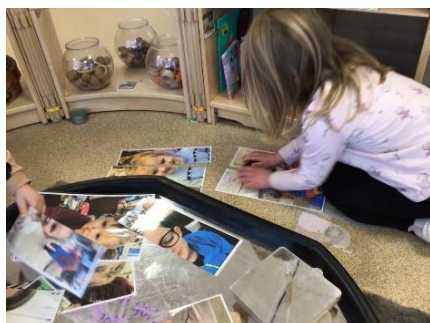


News from the EYC (provided by Nicola 😊)

In the 2-3 room this week we are beginning to recognise familiar books. They have been exploring the story of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. The children used the story to explore different textures. We have also been exploring pushing and pulling using toy cars and ramps.



In the 3-5 room we have had some new friends join us, so we have been working on building friendships and transitions. We have also started to explore symmetry and are looking at how everyone's faces are different.
