Homework Review and Next Steps

Last session, teachers were spending a considerable amount of time planning and preparing homework tasks to complement classroom learning. However, we noticed that the number of pupils completing homework was declining, with some classes only having 15% of learners completing tasks. This led us to reflect on workload and the overall purpose of homework.

Because of the limited responses to last session's homework survey, we paused homework in August. This break allowed everyone time to reflect on its value, and our follow-up survey in November gathered a broad range of thoughtful feedback from families and staff.

We received 141 responses in the November survey and the stats are detailed below: -

In the comments section, some parents shared that removing homework reduced stress for both children and adults at home. They recognised that balancing schoolwork with after-school activities, family time and free play is important for children's wellbeing. Others told us they missed the way homework helps reinforce learning from class, supporting children to practise key skills and develop confidence in different areas of the curriculum.

After listening carefully to comments from parents, carers and staff, and working with the Parent Council, we have agreed to re-introduce homework on a MONTHLY basis.

We have agreed the following: -

- Every class will be set up on Microsoft Teams, and pupils will be issued with login details.
- At the beginning of each month, teachers will post a short overview of prior learning and upcoming learning in Literacy, Numeracy and Interdisciplinary Learning (IDL).
- PE days and Outdoor Learning days will also be shared in these monthly overviews.
- Homework will be set on the first Monday of each month, starting Mon 2nd February.
- Tasks will include a variety of written, digital and practical activities linked to learning from the previous month, helping to reinforce key skills and deepen understanding.
- Homework may also link to Meta Skills and our Rights Respecting Schools work.
- Pupils will be provided with a jotter to record homework such as phonics, sentences or research tasks. Teachers may also issue worksheets.
- Teachers will not provide written feedback on homework activities.
- Families may choose to complete all, some or none of the suggested tasks; staff will not be monitoring completion.

Class teachers will share the first homework grid and monthly learning overview on Monday 2nd February via Microsoft Teams. Please ensure you have logged in to Teams using your child's username and password before this date. A homework jotter, along with all necessary usernames and passwords for online resources, will be sent home with pupils.

Thank you for your ongoing support and for working in partnership with us to ensure our approach to homework continues to promote both learning and wellbeing.

Pupils do not need to put themselves forward if they don't want to.

The date for Scots Verse is Friday 30th January, starting at 9.30. We will inform parents of the finalists today. Parents/carers (of finalists) are invited to come along to the event if they wish.

EYC and P1 pupils had a lovely joint Burns event on Wednesday morning. They performed Scottish songs and listened to traditional Scottish music. The highlight was sharing snack and drinks with each other. A great time was had by all, and our thanks go to all staff who were involved in organising the event.

Our P7 pupils will have their Burns Supper in school on Thursday 29th January.



Rights Respecting School

During recent RRS lessons, P5 pupils have shown great curiosity and maturity as they explored how the law applies to young people. They requested a visit from PC MacPheat, our Campus Officer, who will come into class on Thursday 24th January to talk about Children's Rights (Article 40) and how these link to the youth criminal justice system.

Our RRS Pupil Group are also busy preparing to deliver an informative presentation to all classes on Friday 30th January. As part of our learning about 'Rights Around the World', the pupil group will teach pupils about Malawi and how UNICEF is supporting children to claim their right to clean water and sanitation.

Meta Skills Focus

This month, our whole-school Meta Skill focus is LEADING. Meta Skills are essential life skills that help children develop confidence, resilience, and responsibility, supporting them in all areas of learning and life.

Our Primary 6 pupils delivered a short lesson to each class, helping their peers understand what it means to be a leader. They also demonstrated how leadership can be expressed through everyday actions and choices within the school.

How can YOU support LEADING at home:

- Give your child opportunities to take responsibility, such as helping organise family tasks or leading a game or activity.
- Encourage decision-making and talk about the outcomes of choices.
- Discuss examples of good leadership you notice at home, in the community, or in sport.
- Praise positive leadership behaviours such as helping others, including everyone, and showing empathy.

By working together, we can help our children develop strong leadership skills that will benefit them now and in the future.



YMI - SingFest Event, 12th February

The Youth Music Initiative (YMI) is an integral part of our music service provision for young people in schools across South Ayrshire. This term, our P4 and P5 pupils are taking part in an exciting SingFest project, which focuses on developing skills in singing and performance.
