Please use the Learning Journal app only for sharing achievements and <u>not for communicating about illness and absence.</u> Parents/Carers must still contact the school office as staff do not check the app throughout the day or out with school hours.

#### Curriculum

The EYC have been busy exploring Literacy, Numeracy and Health & Wellbeing through a variety of experiences both indoors and outdoors. The children particularly embraced exploring the tale of Incy Wincy Spider. They are now looking at the story of Elmer the Elephant which introduces pattern in our environment; and the importance of kindness and friendship.







As the term progresses the children will take part in Play on Pedals (pre-schoolers). Some of the children will also engage in the PATHS Programme (Providing Alternative Thinking Strategies) and Talk Boost.

PATHs is a program which aims to improve pupil's emotional intelligence, social skills and empowers them to make positive choices. It helps children manage their behaviour, understand their emotions and work well with others. PATHS consists of a series of lessons that cover topics such as identifying and labelling feelings, controlling impulses, reducing stress, and understanding other people's perspectives.

The Talk Boost program helps develop language and communication skills. Children who are selected to take part in the will attend three sessions per week each lasting 15-20 minutes and will be delivered by Miss Jardine. The sessions include activities that cover the foundation skills in speech, language and communication that children need for learning and understanding new words, as well as having conversations.

#### Harvest competitions

Each child is making a Harvest card and there will be prizes awarded for the best Harvest cards in each class. A card will be put into each parcel which is going out to senior citizens of Dailly.

We are also going to be running a Scarecrow / Guy Fawkes competition where we are inviting families to make any size of scarecrow or guy using old clothes, hats, straw, pillows, etc. The theme is Halloween so we want Scary Scarecrows and Gruesome Guys. All entries will be displayed at the front windows in the hall and along the railings of the school. Each entry will receive a Halloween treat and the winners will be given some Halloween goodies. Each class will also be making a Scarecrow or Guy and these will be on display in the church for the Harvest service.

#### Halloween

On Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October, we are holding a family evening which will start and finish at the Community Centre. It will begin at 5pm and families are encouraged to bring along the Lanterns they made for the Girvan Lantern parade as well as torches and other lights. There will be a range of glow sticks and lights on sale in the hall for the children to purchase. We will gather in the hall before heading off on a 'Spooky Halloween walk' up to the castle. The walk will finish in the hall where everyone can enjoy sausages, burgers and hot drinks. We are hoping it will be a fun night so please bring along any friends and extended family members. Tickets for the event cost £3 for adults and £1 per child. The ticket includes your food and drink. Tickets are available from the school office.

On Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup> October all children can come to school dressed in their Halloween outfits and we will hold a parade so that everyone gets the chance to see the fabulous outfits that our children will be wearing. During the morning the children will go around the village delivering Harvest parcels and performing a small Halloween trick, poem or song for the senior citizens. In the afternoon the children will be able to enjoy fun Halloween activities in their class and join in with the whole school party in the hall.

#### Children in Need

Children in Need Day is on Friday 17<sup>th</sup> November 2023. In school we will be organising fun activities for all pupils



to take part in. On the day the children can come to school dressed in yellow or wearing spots, a small donation towards Children in Need would be greatly appreciated.

The Parent Partnership AGM was held on Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October at 10.30am in the school. All parents/carers are welcome to attend the meetings or pass on any information to one of the office bearers which can then be shared with the Parents Partnership group. We are always looking for new members so please come along or contact the school for more information.

#### Parent Partnership funding

We continue to benefit from funding through Dailly Community Council small grants application which the Parent Partnership apply for on behalf of the school. We have received money to cover the cost of the transport to the Pantomime and Farm Park at Christmas (£650), waterproofs, wellies and wellie socks for the EYC outdoor learning (£645), we purchased garden and playground toys for the children to use during break time (£648.58). This session we have also received funding to cover transport for the Dumfries House trip (£195.50) and the P3 swimming lessons (£365.91).

#### Attendance

Our current overall attendance for the EYC is 94.19%. This is lower than we should be due to a small number of children who are constantly absent. Although it is not compulsory that children attend it is encouraged to support their development. Consistent attendance is beneficial to the children feeling more settled and having a sense of belonging as well as supporting their early learning and development. I understand that children cannot be at school when they are unwell but we have a few children who are off due to parents' lifestyles which is not fair on the children who would benefit greatly from being at nursery.

#### Fruit

We are continuing to promote healthy eating and healthy choices for snack and lunchtime. The school meals provide a balanced diet and the children are all being encouraged to try different foods and to eat their vegetables. Morrisons are very kindly continuing to provide a small amount which is available in all classes for the children to choose for their snack.



#### Relationships, sexual health and parenthood (RSHP)

This term, as part of the Health and Well-Being programme we will be using the national resource for **relationships**, **sexual health** and **parenthood** (RSHP) which is for children and young people.
