Learning Journals

We have introduced Learning Journals this session. It is very similar to SEESAW and is a way of sharing your child's work and achievements. Each parent can view their own child's work. We are using Learning Journals within our EYC as well, so that parents get more regular information, and have the opportunity to share any learning that their child has been involved in at home.

Please use the Learning Journal app only for sharing achievements and <u>not for</u> <u>communicating about illness and absence</u>. Parents/Carers must still contact the school office as staff do not check the app throughout the day or out with school hours.

We are focusing on reading skills this year as part of our school improvement work. We are working closely with the literacy team who are providing training and support. We are also embedding the Accelerated Reader programme which we purchased a year ago for P3 to P7. The children sit STAR tests which gives them a book banding and they are then able to choose books at their own level and enjoy participating in games and quizzes to test their knowledge of the book. We are also working with Giglets which is an online multilingual literacy and language resource, to support Teachers to deliver an engaging and differentiated learning experience for all pupils.

Lantern Parade

Harvest and Halloween

P2, 3 and 4 will be leading our Harvest service at the Church on **Thursday 26th October at 9.30am**. We would love to see parents/carers and members of the community joining us. Normally, our Harvest service prior to the October holidays but due to the children missing nearly a full week as a result of the strikes we have decided to move the date.

As part of our Harvest Celebrations, we are looking for donations of non-perishable foodstuffs such as soup, tinned vegetables, biscuits, pasta and cereal. We will be making up some harvest parcels which will be distributed to senior citizens within Dailly on Tuesday 31st October. The children will be delivering the parcels and will entertain the senior citizens with a Halloween trick, joke or poem.

Each child is making a Harvest card and there will be prizes awarded for the best Harvest cards in each class. A card will be put into each parcel for the senior citizens of Dailly.

We are also going to be running a Scarecrow /Guy Fawkes competition where we are inviting families to make any size of scarecrow or guy using old clothes, hats, straw, pillows, etc. The theme is Halloween so we want Scary Scarecrows and Gruesome Guys. All entries will be displayed in the windows in the hall and along the railings of the school. Each entry will receive a Halloween treat and the winners will be given some Halloween goodies. Each class will also be making a Scarecrow or Guy and these will be on display in the church for the Harvest service.

The Scary Scarecrows and Gruesome Guys should be brought into school on Tuesday 24th October.



Halloween

On Monday 30th October, we are holding a family evening which will start and finish at the Community Centre. It will begin at 5pm and families are encouraged to bring along the Lanterns they made for the Girvan Lantern parade as well as torches and other lights. There will be a range of glow sticks and lights on sale in the hall for families to purchase. We will gather in the hall before heading off on a 'Spooky Halloween walk' up to the castle. The walk will finish in the hall where everyone can enjoy sausages, burgers and hot drinks. We are hoping it will be a fun night so please bring along any friends and extended family members. Tickets for the event cost £3 for adults and £1 per child. The ticket includes your food and drink. Tickets are available from the school office.

On **Tuesday 31st October** all children can come to school dressed in their Halloween outfits and we will hold a parade so that everyone gets the chance to see the fabulous outfits that our children will be wearing. During the morning the children will go around the village delivering Harvest parcels and performing a small Halloween trick, poem or song for the to the senior citizens. In the afternoon the children will be able to enjoy fun Halloween activities in their class and join in with the whole school party in the hall.

Children in Need

Children in Need Day is on **Friday 17th November 2023**. In school we will be organising fun activities for all pupils

to take part in. On the day the children can come to school dressed in yellow or wearing spots, a small donation towards Children in Need would be greatly appreciated.

Gaiety Pantomime



Our trip to the Gaiety Theatre to see Cinderella will take place on **Friday 15th December 2023.** All pupils in Primary 1 to Primary 7 will have the opportunity to go along and enjoy the show. We are subsidising the cost of the panto and the transport through fundraising efforts. The parental contribution per pupil will be £10 which is a greatly reduced price. The school will subsidise the cost through fund raising next term.

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Any parents who have not paid the pantomime full should do so through the online school payment system ParentPay. Families with 3 or more children will pay a reduced cost.

Swimming

Primary 3 have started their block of swimming lessons at the Quay Zone. Last session we prioritised P4 and 5 meaning that in the last few years every child in P4-7 has benefitted from swimming lessons.

Each year we also organise some swimming lessons for our Early Years children to introduce them to the water. The Pre-school children will benefit from 4 sessions at the Quay Zone later in the year.

All of this is only possible through the ongoing fundraising efforts and the great support we have from all of our families and the Community Council.



Scottish Parliament

As part of Primary 6 and 7's studies of the electoral and parliamentary system, we have booked to take them for a special visit to the Scottish Parliament in Edinburgh on **Wednesday 13th December.** They will be visiting the Parliament in the morning and then they will have the chance to see some of the sights including Holyrood Palace, the Royal Mile, Edinburgh Castle and Princess Street Gardens. *Details to follow*

Dumfries House

We have planned an educational outing to Dumfries House on Wednesday 11th October for Primary 4 and 5 where they will be visiting the farm and get first-hand experience of animal welfare, sustainable farming practices and develop knowledge of food production systems and how to eat well. They will also get to spend time with various animals including cows, sheep, geese, ducks, turkeys, hens and pigs.



P5-7 Residential

We have once again booked a residential visit for Primary 5-7 to Dolphin House in April next year which is in the grounds of Culzean Castle Country Park. The purpose of this is to allow them to pursue a wide range of outdoor activities as well as encouraging team building and leadership skills.

It offers a multi-activity residential course which combines fun and personal development in a lively and supportive environment. The children are never pushed beyond their comfort zone, however the fully trained instructors have proven success in nurturing and supporting even the most apprehensive child. Some of activities will include Canoeing, Climbing, Hill Walking, Team Building and Orienteering. Whilst the children are at Dolphin House they will be participating in the John Muir Award which is an environmental award with a focus around themes of Discovery, Exploration and Conservation.



Heartstart



CPR is one of the most important lessons young people can learn. Cardiac arrests can happen to anyone, anywhere, at any age. If they happen out of hospital in the UK, the survival rate is less than 10%. That is why it is crucial that young people know what to do. Of course, we hope CPR is a skill they never have to use.

By the end of the training, the children will know the following:

- The difference between cardiac arrest and a heart attack.
- How to respond if they see an unconscious person, including how to make an emergency call and get help.
- How to use a defibrillator.
- How to work as a team and perform CPR safely.

Mental Health and Resilience

Nurture

Mrs Eaglesham and Mrs Vance have started a block of Nurture sessions with a small group of children to support them with specific social and emotional issues. We are working closely with the South Ayrshire Nurture Outreach Team. Both Mrs Vance and Mrs Eaglesham have attended Nurture training and are excellent at using their skills to support the children throughout the school.

Relationships, sexual health and parenthood (RSHP)

This term, as part of the Health and Well-Being programme we will be using the national resource for **relationships**, **sexual health** and **parenthood** (RSHP) which is for children and young people.

Last week we started a special nurturing programme for parents/carers to provide practical information as well as an opportunity to meet other parents and have a chat and a cuppa. The Nurturing Programme helps deal with those everyday challenges that your children throw at you. It is a *10-week programme and is taking place at the Community Centre on a Monday from 1-2.45pm.* It is run by Fiona Dailly (Nurture Support - South Ayrshire Council) who is very experienced in supporting young people and their families with everyday challenges. It will be very informal but hopefully helpful all parents/carers with children of all ages. It would be great to see some more people go along next week.

The Parent Partnership AGM was held on Monday 9th October at 10.30am in the school. All parents/carers are welcome to attend the meetings or pass on any information to one of the office bearers which can then be shared with the Parents Partnership group. We are always looking for new members so please come along or contact the school for more information.

Parent Partnership funding

We continue to benefit from funding through Dailly Community Council small grants application which the Parent Partnership apply for on behalf of the school. We have received money to cover the cost of the transport to the Pantomime at Christmas (£650), waterproofs, wellies and wellie socks for the EYC outdoor learning (£645), we purchased garden and playground toys for the children to use during break time (£648.58). This session we have also received funding to cover transport for the Dumfries House trip (£195.50) and the P3 swimming lessons (£365.91).

We also received £13,000 to help us to fund a 3 year rolling programme for P4-7 to attend ACE days (Adventure Centre for Education), which we have not been able to do in the last few years due to COVID and a lack of funding. Mrs Vance, the Secretary for the Parent Partnership has done a brilliant job completing all of the funding applications to make this possible. This means that children currently in stages P2-7 will benefit from these activities.

Attendance - Every Learner Every Day !

Our current overall attendance for the school is 91.39%. This is lower than the level that we should be at due to a small number of children who are constantly absent. I understand that children cannot be at school when they are unwell but we have a few children who have regular unexplained days off. Last session in South Ayrshire Primary schools, just over 37,000 days (the equivalent of over 220,000 teaching hours!) were lost to unauthorised absence.

Poor attendance has been linked to lower levels of attainment, peer relationships, emotional and behavioural difficulties and poorer employment opportunities, which is why we want to see **Every Learner Every Day**!

School Lunches

We have recently introduced Parent pay which enables parents to choose their children's meals as well as pay for school outings. Parents are reminded that they should choose their child's lunch and can do so up to 3 weeks in advance as a lot of parents are leaving the children to do this in school which is taking away from valuable learning time. There are also a lot of very 'fussy' eaters so we would appreciate if parents could choose their child's lunch as they know what he/she likes to eat.

Parents/carers should only select 2 courses as this is more than enough for the children to eat at lunchtime and many of them do not eat a lot. Some children spend most of their lunchtime in the dinner hall.

All children from the EYC up to P5 receive free lunches which includes 2 courses but parents still need to connect with parent pay in order to choose their child's meal and to be able to pay for other school excursions and events.

Fruit

We are continuing to promote healthy eating and healthy choices for break and lunchtime, particularly for those children who bring packed lunches. The school meals provide a balanced diet and the children are all being encouraged to try different foods and to eat their vegetables. We are asking that parents also try to provide healthy packed lunches with sandwiches, fruit, yoghurt and nutritious snacks and avoid the inclusion of too many sugary snacks or family sized bags of crisps and treats.

Please remember that children should not be given any products containing nuts due to potential allergies including 'nutella'.

Morrisons are very kindly continuing to provide a small amount of fruit which is available in all classes for the children to choose for their snack.



Water in class

All of the children now have bottles for use in class and this keeps everyone the same. Children are welcome to bring their own bottle with juice or flavoured water for lunchtime. **Energy drinks and fizzy juice are not allowed in school.**
