#### **Students**

We have a number of students working in the school this term across most classes. Rachel Hillhouse is an HNC student within the EYC. We then have Victoria Otterson who is in her third year of her teaching degree. She is teaching in P1. Victoria completed her Early Years placement within our Early Years Centre earlier this year. Kaidyn Mitchell is a second-year student and she is working in P5/4. Claire Horne a final year teaching student and she is returning to P7/6 where she had a very successful placement earlier this session.

#### Scottish Celebrations

All of the children from the Early Years Centre to P7 have been developing their knowledge and understanding of the Scots' language through poetry and songs, as well as producing Scottish art work and completing research projects. We did not have any children this year who wished to recite their poem but Indie Boyd won the art prize for the Early Years Centre.

#### Scottish Concert

Our Scottish Concert took place place on Friday  $2^{nd}$  February and as always with these events was standing room only. All classes performed songs, and the winners of the poetry competition winners shared their poems.



#### Curriculum

The EYC have been busy exploring Literacy, Numeracy and Health & Wellbeing through a variety of experiences both indoors and outdoors. The children have been being particularly creative with lots of painting and crafts. Some of the children have shown strength in still life portraits.

There has been lots of role play around areas of focus and some of the children have been keen to prepare the ladies lots of healthy meals in the home corner.




The weather has not always been kind but the children are 'wee weather warriors' and have continued to make use of their time outdoors; exploring forces, using the equipment/bikes and developing their gross motor skills via running, jumping and balancing.

The Play on Pedals programme has also continued for the pre-schoolers with 4 children now having progressed to pedal bikes without stabilisers.








There has been a huge focus around transition for the pre-schoolers and Primary 1 with the children joining together 2-3 times a week. During these sessions the children have been focusing on Music, French and Science. The children look forward to these sessions as they take a relaxed approach to visiting and engaging with Primary 1 and the class teacher.

Whilst the older children enjoy transition the 2s and ante pre-school children are able to benefit from a quieter environment where staff can focus on language and communication, and counting via songs and rhymes. This time also provides those children with the opportunity to make their voices heard and supports everyone in being able to talk about their learning.



#### Childsmile

The EYC children are supported to brush their teeth on a daily basis. We want to ensure that all children have an equal opportunity to develop their oral hygiene skills. **Childsmile** is a national programme designed to improve the oral health of children in Scotland and reduce inequalities both in dental health and access to dental services. The programme delivers a range of preventive care for children in early years and primary.

Please help support us by ensuring that your child brushes twice a day with a suitable toothbrush and fluoride toothpaste. Spare toothbrushes and toothpaste are regularly distributed and are always available should anyone require more. Please speak to staff who will be happy to help. 

#### World Book Day

World Book Day changes lives through a love of books and reading. The purpose of it is to promote reading for pleasure, offering every child and young person the opportunity to have a book of their own. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family




circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income.

We want to see more children, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, with a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and the improved life chances this brings them. This year we will be celebrating World Book Day with a dress down in your Pyjamas day. We are going to be promoting getting cosy and reading at any time in the day with our 'Drop everything and read!' sessions throughout the day. We will also be offering a book swap for families to bring in any old books, children and adults, and swap them with others for free. There will be a range of activities on throughout the day for each class to participate in and parents are welcome to join us – details to follow.

#### STEM Week - 19th to 23rd March

Mr Woods and Miss Baillie are organising a programme of activities with a specific focus on Science and Maths as well as some Outdoor Learning. This year, we will be combining science and maths week together. This is because the theme of the week is "time" and maths and science are inextricably linked. We will be experimenting, researching and analysing many topics over the week. There will be a family challenge to be completed at home. We will round the week off with a house challenge and assembly. Following science week, we hope to have a visit to the Glasgow Science Centre to further our knowledge, date to be confirmed.

We will be organising a fun, fundraising day on **Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March** as part of Red Nose Day. The activities will include working in houses to design a red nose, baking biscuits with our new baking equipment, sports activities in the hall and a whole school quiz at the end of the day.
