Students

We have a number of students working in the school this term across most classes. Rachel Hillhouse is an HNC student within the EYC. We then have Victoria Otterson who is in her third year of her teaching degree. She is teaching in P1. Victoria completed her Early Years placement within our Early Years Centre earlier this year. Kaidyn Mitchell is a second-year student and she is working in P5/4. Claire Horne a final year teaching student and she is returning to P7/6 where she had a very successful placement earlier this session.

SUMDOG

Noah was over the moon to be 1st place on the leader board for the South Ayrshire competition on SumDog. What a fantastic achievement. The competition ran between the 26th January and the 1st February. In South Ayrshire, Dailly's Primary 7s were also in 1st place on the Leader board, Primary 6 were in 3rd place and Primary 3 in 6th place. Great achievement for a small school and brilliant incentive to brush up on your maths skills.



Accelerated Reader

We are focusing on reading skills this year as part of our school improvement work. We are embedding the Accelerated Reader programme which we purchased a year ago for P3 to P7. The children sit STAR tests which gives them a book banding and they are then able to choose books at their own level and enjoy participating in games and quizzes to test their knowledge of the book. We are also working with Giglets which is an online multilingual literacy and language resource, to support Teachers to deliver an engaging and differentiated learning experience for all pupils.

Scottish Parliament

Just before Christmas the P6 and 7s were very lucky to have a visit to the Scottish Parliament and to see some of the local tourist attractions in Edinburgh. During our visit to the Scottish Parliament, we all had to go through security just like at the airport. As part of their tour of the parliament they spent time in the Debating Chamber and were lucky enough to meet two local MSPs Elena Whitham and Carol Mochan.







They then had a walking tour of some famous landmarks in Edinburgh. Mr Woods was very knowledgeable about the City of Edinburgh so was a great tour guide. They took a walk down the Royal Mile, visited Edinburgh Castle and watched the 1pm firing of the gun. We saw lots of history and had lots of fun!



Anti-bullying workshop

In January, P4-7 pupils had a visit from a live touring production called HOPE. "Hope" is a powerful and entertaining drama telling the story of three young people whose lives are affected by bullying. The children participated very well with P5/4 and P7/6 benefitting from separate workshops in addition to the performance.







Glasgow Science Centre - On Tour

The whole school also benefitted from interactive workshops provided by the Glasgow Science Centre. P1-3 had the 'Go Oxygen Go Science Show and Body Vision Exhibit Session where they got to explore real parts of the body.







P4-7 had the 'Get Active Science Show' and the BodyVision Exhibit Session. The children were so excited using all of the cool Scientific equipment and the only disappointment was when it was packed up and taken away at the end.








Scottish Celebrations

Parents/Carers and members of the community were very impressed with the standard of performance and the confidence of our children. Alloway Burns' Supper

The Alloway Burns' Club organises this special event and invites three P7 pupils from each school to participate. This will take place on Tuesday 27th February at Ayr Town Hall and Indie McCleary, Will Mullen and Lisann Suiviste will be representing our school by delivering the Immortal Memory. They will enjoy the full Burns Supper experience and will be hosted at a table of up to ten guests, facilitated by S6 pupils from the four cluster secondaries.

Sport and Outdoor Learning

This term we are running a few after school clubs as well as having input from Caitlan Flanagan, our Active Schools Coordinator. Every Monday night we have 'Monday Madness, ran by staff through the Thriving Communities organisation. On a Tuesday we also have a Gymnastics club which for P3-7 which Miss Scott and Caitlan are running.

Later in the term there will be a basketball club for P4-7s. P4-7 will also have the opportunity during their P.E. sessions to get some handball coaching prior to participating in the Cluster Handball competition on and Basketball club Handball event on Wednesday 27th February ay Girvan Academy.

ACE days

P4-7 pupils are benefitting from a 3-year rolling programme of ACE days (Adventure Centre for Education), which we have not been able to do in the last few years due to COVID and a lack of funding. We received £13,320 from Foundation Scotland. P5/4 have attended both of their planned days Day 1 - Canoeing and Paddle boarding, Day 2 - Archery and Bush craft, P7/6 have attended Day 1 and their second day will be Rock Climbing and Abseiling.







Spirit of sport

This term, Primary 7/6 have been working with our Active Schools coordinator, Caitlin, participating in the Spirit of Sport Award. This award teaches them the values of sport through playing different sports including handball, basketball, netball and dodgeball. We are also going to be participating in the Girvan cluster handball festival on Wednesday 27th March at Girvan Academy 4-5pm. Pupils have the opportunity to win the Spirit of Sport Award at the festival through showing good sportsmanship and encouraging their teammates.

P4 swimming

Primary 4 pupils started their 6-week block of swimming lessons at the Quay Zone and unfortunately due to storm damage they only received 2 lessons. The Quay Zone have managed to reach an agreement to make use of the old Maybole Pool in the interim period which will allow their commitment to swimming lessons to continue.




Forthcoming events

World Book Day

World Book Day changes lives through a love of books and reading. The purpose of it is to promote reading for pleasure, offering every child and young person the opportunity to have a book of their own. Reading for pleasure is the single biggest indicator of a child's future success – more than their family circumstances, their parents' educational background or their income.

We want to see more children, particularly those from disadvantaged backgrounds, with a life-long habit of reading for pleasure and the improved life chances this brings them. This year we will be celebrating World Book Day with a dress down in your Pyjamas day. We are going to be promoting getting cosy and reading at any time in the day with our 'Drop everything and read!' sessions throughout the day. We will also be offering a book swap for families to bring in any old books, children and adults, and swap them with others for free. There will be a range of activities on throughout the day for each class to participate in and parents are welcome to join us – details to follow.

P5-7 Residential


We have once again booked a residential visit for Primary 5-7 to Dolphin House from 15th 18th April which is in the grounds of Culzean Castle Country Park. The purpose of this is to allow them to pursue a wide range of outdoor activities as well as encouraging team building and leadership skills.



The children are never pushed beyond their comfort zone, however the fully trained instructors have proven success in nurturing and supporting even the most apprehensive child. Some of activities will include Canoeing, Climbing, Hill Walking, Team Building and Orienteering. Whilst the children are at Dolphin House they will be participating in the John Muir Award which is an environmental award with a focus around themes of Discovery, Exploration and Conservation.

STEM Week - 19th to 23rd March

Mr Woods and Miss Baillie are organising a programme of activities with a specific focus on Science and Maths as well as some Outdoor Learning. This year, we will be combining science and maths week together. This is because the theme of the week is "time" and maths and science are inextricably linked. We will be experimenting, researching and analysing many topics over the week. There will be a family challenge to be completed at home. We will round the week off with a house challenge and assembly. Following science week, we hope to have a visit to the Glasgow Science Centre to further our knowledge, date to be confirmed.



Red Nose Day

We will be organising a fun, fundraising day on Friday 15th March as part of Red Nose Day. The activities will include working in houses to design a red nose, baking biscuits with our new baking equipment, sports activities in the hall and a whole school quiz at the end of the day. The school has ordered some Red noses for the children and the



Parent Partnership through their Fundraising efforts have agreed to cover the cost of one Red Nose for each Child. A percentage of profits go to help tackle poverty here in the UK and across the World.

This year our new music teacher Mhairi Gibson will be leading the class performance at the Easter Service with each class having the opportunity to share songs and instrumental performances as part of their learning this term.

P1 Burns' Cottage

Primary 1 are going on an outing to Burns; Cottage and the Burns' Centre in Alloway as part of their topic about Scotland. We have been fortunate to receive some funding for this and will be participating in the 'Timorous Beasties' workshop. We will also be going for a walk to the Auld Kirk to have a look.



Seasons for Growth

Mrs Parker and Mrs Eaglesham are running a programme for small groups called, 'Seasons For Growth'. This is an eight week programme to support pupils who have experienced, for example, separation, divorce or bereavement and is based on research that highlights the importance of social support and the need to practise new skills to cope effectively with change and loss. The programme focuses on self-esteem, managing feelings, problem-solving, decision-making, effective communication and support networks. The current 'Seasons for Growth' session is underway, however please get in touch with Mrs Parker if you would like more information and would like your child to take part in the next session.

Parent Partnership Update

We continue to benefit from funding through Dailly Community Council small grants application which the Parent Partnership apply for on behalf of the school.

The Parent Partnership have been running a weekly bonus ball which has been very popular with parents, carers, the wider community and staff. With the great support of our school community, since starting it in the last week of November it has managed to raise £308.50. When all the numbers are paid the Parent Partnership receives £28.50 and the winner receives £30.50.

Attendance - Every Learner Every Day!

Our current overall attendance for the school is 92.17%. This is lower than the level that we should be at due to a small number of children who are constantly absent. I understand that children cannot be at school when they are unwell but we have a few children who have regular unexplained days off.

Last session in South Ayrshire Primary schools, just over 37,000 days (the equivalent of over 220,000 teaching hours!) were lost to unauthorised absence.

Poor attendance has been linked to lower levels of attainment, peer relationships, emotional and behavioural difficulties and poorer employment opportunities, which is why we want to see Every Learner Every Day!

School Lunches

We introduced Parent pay this session which enables parents to choose their children's meals as well as pay for school outings. Parents are reminded that they should choose their child's lunch and can do so up to 3 weeks in advance as a lot of parents are leaving the children to do this in school which is taking away from valuable learning time. There are also a lot of very 'fussy' eaters so we would appreciate if parents could choose their child's lunch as they know what he/she likes to eat.

Parents/carers should only select 2 courses as this is more than enough for the children to eat at lunchtime and many of them do not eat a lot. Some children spend most of their lunchtime in the dinner hall.

All children from the EYC up to P5 receive free lunches which includes 2 courses but parents still need to connect with parent pay in order to choose their child's meal and to be able to pay for other school excursions and events.

Fruit

We are continuing to promote healthy eating and healthy choices for break and lunchtime, particularly for those children who bring packed lunches. The school meals provide a balanced diet and the children are all being encouraged to try different foods and to eat their vegetables. We are asking that parents also try to provide healthy packed lunches with sandwiches, fruit, yoghurt and nutritious snacks and avoid the inclusion of too many sugary snacks or family sized bags of crisps and treats.

Please remember that children should not be given any products containing nuts due to potential allergies including 'nutella'.

Morrisons are very kindly continuing to provide a small amount of fruit which is available in all classes for the children to choose for their snack.

Water in class

All of the children now have water bottles for use in class and this keeps everyone the same. Children are welcome to bring their own bottle with juice or flavoured water for lunchtime. Energy drinks and fizzy juice are not allowed in school.
