#### Meet the Staff

We are looking forward to welcoming parents and carers into school next week for our first open morning of the session on Thursday 19<sup>th</sup> September. All Parents/Carers will be welcome to join us anytime between 9.15 and 11.45. Parents/Carers can move freely between classes during this time, supporting their child with the planned activities, having a look at their work and engaging with the teaching and support staff. We will be providing tea, coffee and a breakfast roll from 10.30-10.45 to allow the children time to go out for their break.

#### **Harvest Service**

Our Harvest Service will take place in Dailly Parish Church on Monday 7<sup>th</sup> October at 9.30am. EYC to P1-3 will be singing some Harvest songs and P4-7 will be sharing their Samba drumming which they have just started to learn with Mrs Gibson. Following the service at the Church Parents and Carers are invited to come back to the school for a cup of tea or coffee and have a look at the Scholastic Book Fair.

#### Costume Recycle

As part of our Harvest Celebrations, we are looking for donations of non-perishable foodstuffs such as soup, tinned vegetables, biscuits, pasta and cereal. We will be making up some harvest parcels which will be distributed to senior citizens within Dailly on **Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> October**. The children will be delivering the parcels in their Halloween costumes and will entertain the senior citizens with a Halloween trick, joke or poem. This was a huge success last year instead of delivering the parcels prior to the October holidays.

Any donations of non-perishable food stuffs should be sent to the school by Monday 28<sup>th</sup> October to give us time to make up the parcels. ### Harvest competitions

Each child will be making a Harvest card and there will be prizes awarded for the best Harvest cards in each class. A card will be put into each parcel for the senior citizens of Dailly.

We are also going to be running again a Scarecrow /Guy Fawkes competition where we are inviting families to make any size of scarecrow or guy using old clothes, hats, straw, pillows, etc. The theme is Halloween so we want Scary Scarecrows and Gruesome Guys. All entries will be displayed in the windows in the school hall and be part of the decorations for the Halloween parties. Each entry will receive a Halloween treat and the

winners will be given some Halloween goodies. Each class will also be making a Scarecrow or Guy and these will be on display in the church for the Harvest service.

The Scary Scarecrows and Gruesome Guys should be brought into school on Tuesday 22nd October. This allows families time during the holidays to make them.

#### Halloween Disco and parties

We are holding a Halloween disco on Tuesday 29<sup>th</sup> October from 5.00pm to 7.00pm in the school hall for P1-7 pupils. The children will be provided with a burger and juice. The children are encouraged to dress up and there will be fun activities arranged. Tickets for the event Disco will be £1 and are available from the school.

On **Thursday 31**<sup>st</sup> **October** all children can come to school dressed in their Halloween outfits. During the morning the children will go around the village delivering Harvest parcels and performing a small Halloween trick, poem or song for the to the senior citizens. In the afternoon the children will be able to enjoy fun interhouse Halloween activities.

#### Children in Need

Children in Need Day is on Friday 15<sup>th</sup> November 2024. In school we will be organising fun activities for all pupils to take part in. On the day the children we will be having a non-uniform day and children are encouraged to come to school dressed in yellow or spotty or wearing their pyjamas in return for a £1 donation towards Children in Need.

#### Christmas Fayre

The Christmas Fayre will be taking place on  $27^{th}$  November from 4.00-6.00pm. The Parent Partnership have booked Santa's Grotto and a visit from the Reindeer. The children will be able to visit the reindeer in the afternoon and then any families who wish to visit the reindeer can do so at the fayre in the evening. We are selling tables for anyone wishing a stall at £10 a table and this year we will have access to wifi for public use so that people can use contactless to purchase items from the stall holders. #### **Gaiety Pantomime**



Our trip to the Gaiety Theatre to see Cinderella will take place on **Thursday 12**<sup>th</sup> **December 2024.** All pupils in Primary 1 to Primary 7 will have the opportunity to go along and enjoy the show. We are subsidising the cost of the panto and the transport through fundraising efforts.

The parental contribution per pupil will be £10 which is a greatly reduced price as the tickets are £12 plus the cost of transport which is approximately £8 per pupil.. The school will subsidise the cost through fund raising next term. Parents can pay for the pantomime through the online school payment system ParentPay. Families with 3 or more children will pay a reduced cost and will be contacted separately.

#### P5-7 Residential

We have booked the residential visit for Primary 5-7 this year to Lockerbie Manor in Dumfries and Galloway. This will take place from 19<sup>th</sup> to 21<sup>st</sup> February and will cost £174 per pupil. They will be sleeping in wooden camping pods for up to 4 children each. The purpose of this is to allow them to pursue a wide range of outdoor activities as well as encouraging team building and leadership skills. We intend to work with the children to engage in a variety of fundraising activities including a sponsored walk to raise funds to ensure that it is affordable for all children who wish to attend. More details will be sent out to P5-7 parents in due course.

#### Parent Partnership funding

At Dailly Fete in May the Parent Partnership had a raffle stall and raised £229. The Sponsored Walk up the Byne hill raised an amazing £1032. We are now receiving donations from the weekly bonus ball from the Dailly Store and have recently received £150. Since starting the Bonus Ball in December 2023 we have raised £921. The Parent Partnership are covering the costs of the Reindeer visit and Santa's Grotto at the Christmas Fayre from their fundraising efforts.

#### Attendance - Every Learner Every Day!

In South Ayrshire we know that going to school is a great way to prepare children and young people for the future. We've launched the 'Every Learner, Every Day' campaign to highlight the benefits of going to school, such as having fun with friends, learning about the world, and developing life skills.

South Ayrshire young people have been appearing in adverts and posters to help encourage attendance and highlight positive experiences at schools within South Ayrshire. Our current overall attendance for the school is 97% and EYC 93.64%. I understand that children cannot be at school when they are unwell but we have a few children who have regular unexplained days off. We also have a number of families choosing to take their children out of school and on holiday during term time. This is extremely disruptive to your child's learning and results in them requiring a lot of support in order to catch-up on lost learning experiences.

#### **Parking**

We are experiencing a lot of traffic parked in front of the school at pick-up and drop-off times. The majority of our children live in the village and should be able to walk to and from school. I would encourage all children and parents to be walking, cycling or scooting to school.

There are clear white and yellow lines marked in front of the school and parents should not under any circumstances be parking on these lines. They are for access for emergency services and for the safety of the children entering and leaving the building. We will be putting cones along the lines to ensure that parents observe this and I would appreciate your cooperation on this matter.
