I would like to thank our parents and carers for their ongoing support and I would like to wish you a very happy Christmas and New Year. I look forward to seeing your all after the holidays.








South Ayrshire Dance Competition




The Twinkly Nativity

The children were supported in putting their performance together by local theatre company, Livewire.






