
















## DALMILLING PRIMARY SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: 2023-2024

Last session in South Ayrshire Primary schools, just over 37,000 days (the equivalent of over 220,000 teaching hours!) were lost to unauthorised absence.

Poor attendance has been linked to lower levels of attainment, peer relationships, emotional and behavioural difficulties and poorer employment opportunities, which is why we want to see **Every Learner Every Day!** 







### Pupil Voice! You Said! We Did!

## World Book Day Thursday 7th March 2024



### **Dress as a Word!**

Children will be invited to come dressed as a word e.g. SPARKLY (wear a sparkly top) or SHADOW (wear all black). Instead of Star of the Week next week, teachers will be asked to pick the most creative representation of a word for assembly.

### Choose a Story!

All teachers have chosen a book to read to the children. Children will have the opportunity to pick which story they hear.

Children can also bring their favourite book to school to share. All children will receive a World Book Day Book and take part in classroom activities throughouthe day.

## Red Nose Day

We will be celebrating Red Nose Day this year on the 15<sup>th</sup> March 2024. Pupils are invited to dress down for this day and they will take part in activities within their own classes.



## **Outdoor Learning**

We have been developing the use of the outdoors to develop numeracy and maths skills. This has included using the raised beds at the allotment to problem solve the area of the beds. Children were also splatting chalk numbers in the playground with water filled syringes. They then worked out subtraction calculations. The children are benefitting from learning whilst getting fresh air at the same time. Pupils will now work on a follow up lesson outdoors with their class teachers.
