NEWS FROM OUR CLASSES – OUR TERM 3 HIGHLIGHTS

All of our classes have been very busy learning this term. Earlier this week, our P7 House and Vice Captains visited classes to ask the children what they had enjoyed learning the most. Here is what the children said.

Class	Our Learning Highlights
Early Years Class	 We have enjoyed: Planting sunflower seeds and broad beans; Playing with all of the toys in the role play corner – we like to dress up and to pretend to be different people. We loved the visit from the Fire Service. We got to speak with the Fire Fighters and we also learned about the Fire Truck. We learned about how the Fire Service helps people. We also love Bookbug and singing – stories with Bookbug is one of our favourites.
Primary 1	 We have enjoyed: ↓ Learning about symmetry – drawing the missing half of a picture was good fun! ↓ Working with children from P1/2 and P2/3 to learn about Knights, Dragons and Castles; ↓ Writing imaginative stories about dragons; ↓ Learning about spring.
Primary 1/2	 We have enjoyed: ↓ Learning about all the different parts of a book: the contents page, the index page, the front cover and author; ↓ Learning about Knights, Castles and Dragons – we particularly liked using foil to create Knights of our own. ↓ Learning to speak in Gaelic and in French. ↓ Exploring 2D shapes – we learned that 2D shapes are flat shapes.
Primary 2/3	We have enjoyed: ↓ Adding and subtracting money – we learned how to add different amounts and we also learned how to work out change. ↓ Fitness circuits in PE – we have a great time in PE lessons. ↓ Practising our mental maths skills through our weekly 'Big Maths Beat That!' challenges. ↓ Learning to speak in Gaelic with Mrs Davidson.
Primary 4	 We have enjoyed: ↓ Learning about the Amazon Rainforest. This has been a brilliant topic because we have learned about Rainforest animals and where they live. ↓ Learning to multiply and to divide in maths. We have also learned how to draw graphs to show information. ↓ Gaelic through Art: we worked with local artists to recreate one of the Murals from Dundonald Castle and we learned how to say each of the colours in Gaelic. ↓ Reading – we have learned how to answer comprehension questions and are really good at this.

Primary 4/5	 We have enjoyed: Maths. We have been learning about weight and measure. Today, we used our skills in measure to make dough. Learning about micro-organisms in Science. We were fascinated by our 'mouldy bread experiment' which helped us to understand that micro-organisms are living things. Investigating floating and sinking in Science; we made our very own boats using tinfoil. Learning to swim at Troon Pool (P5).
Primary 5	We have enjoyed: ↓ Designing our own products and pitching these to the Dragons during our 'Dragon's Den' project. The Dragons were Mrs Dunsmuir, Mrs Crawford, Mr Whiteside and Mrs Kerr! ↓ Learning how to grow potatoes by planting some in pots and soil with Mrs Kerr. The shoots are now visible which is very exciting. ↓ Learning about Scots Language and Scottish Poetry. ↓ Indoor Bowling with the volunteers from Dundonald Bowling Club.
Primary 5/6	 We have enjoyed: Learning about what life was like during the Victorian era – we researched Victorian schools and compared the life of a Victorian child to our lives today. We also learned about workhouses and the life of Queen Victoria. Reading and studying the novel, 'Wonder' – this is an excellent story and we can't wait to find out what happens next. Improving our fitness during PE lessons – we have all worked hard and moved up to the next level in the bleep test. Presenting solo talks on different subjects, such as: countries, animals and sports.
Primary 7	 We have enjoyed: Learning debating skills through participating in the Marr College P7 Debating Challenge. We also enjoyed developing our general knowledge in preparation for the Marr College P7 Quiz led by Troon Rotary Club. Participating in the Cross Country Competition at Rozelle in Ayr. Learning how to identify acids and alkalis through setting up Science Investigations using cabbage water. Learning how to bowl through participating in indoor bowling lessons with Dundonald Bowling Club.

SPOTLIGHT ON SCHOOL AND EARLY YEARS IMPROVEMENT PRIORITIES

Improving Health and Wellbeing

Across our school and early years centre, we have been focusing on improving children's emotional health and wellbeing through PATHS lessons and activities. PATHS stands for: Positive, Alternative, Thinking Strategies. During PATHS time in class, children learn about the different feelings and emotions that we all experience and strategies for managing these feelings. Registration for Primary 1 took place earlier this term and we look forward to getting to know our new Primary 1 pupils and families in Term 4.


Mrs Muir, who will teach P1 in August 2023, will spend time working in the Early Years Centre, with the pre-school children, in May.
