EARLY YEARS CENTRE

This term, our Early Years children have been learning about and exploring Autumn – we have used our senses and have: **looked** for colourful leaves; **felt** and **heard** the colder wind and rain. We hope that the children enjoy looking out for signs of Autumn during the October holiday too.

We have also enjoyed taking part in a range of construction and building activities both indoors and out. We have created some amazing dens and towers. Playing outdoors and making obstacle courses is one of our favourites!

PRIMARY 1

Our Primary 1 class has settled in beautifully and are enjoying learning and playing in school. We have worked hard to begin to learn the initial sounds and are working hard blending these to read words. In Numeracy, we have learned all about numbers to 10, patterns and 2D shapes. We have enjoyed learning about People Who Help Us and look forward to a visit from PC Harrower.

PRIMARY 1/2

Primary 1/2 have had a fantastic start to our new school year. We have settled in wonderfully well and are working very hard. In Literacy, we have worked on writing our names and on learning new sounds. We have also enjoyed stories and songs. In Numeracy, some children have investigated number bonds to 15 and number families, while others have learned about numbers to 20. P1 children have learned all about numbers to 10. We've had lots of fun in gym with ball games and have also learned all about Diwali. We now know lots of dinosaur facts too and can explain what we can do in school to be a good friend.

PRIMARY 2/3

In P2/3, we have been investigating how whole numbers are formed and the importance of the place value of each number during numeracy lessons. We had fun exploring this using concrete materials, pictures and symbols. Meanwhile, in literacy, we have focused on following and writing instructions – we particularly enjoyed learning a dance that we then wrote instructions for. We have also been learning about how we can develop sustainable homes and communities through our Houses and Homes topic. Why not ask us about the story of Eco-Wolf and the Three Pigs? It really got us thinking!

PRIMARY 3/4

Our Primary 3/4 class has worked extremely hard this term. We have enjoyed learning about whole numbers and fractions in numeracy and maths. Our class topic has been "Ancient Greece" – we learned about Greek Gods and discovered the similarities between Ancient Greece and Ancient Egypt. In Literacy, we particularly liked writing a story from the point of view of a time-traveller – this was very exciting.

PRIMARY 5

We have had an extremely busy term in P5 and have had the opportunities to take part in both swimming lessons at Troon Pool and Scottish Country Dance, with visiting specialist, Mrs Brown. In maths, we have been learning about Place Value and 3 Dimensional objects. Our novel, Bill's New Frock, has given us lots of opportunities to develop our reading skills and we are becoming more confident in being able to predict accurately based on what we have read. We have also had fun learning about the Vikings and have experimented using the Viking alphabet (runes) to crack codes and solve problems.

PRIMARY 5/6

P5/6 have enjoyed reading Coraline as our novel study and have worked very hard on improving our Grammar and Comprehension Skills. In Maths we have been focusing on adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing. We have developed a range of mental strategies and can also complete increasingly advanced written calculations in our jotters.

In P.E we have been developing our Basketball skills and have learned how to make a variety of passes and shots with accuracy.

We have enjoyed learning all about The Scottish Wars of Independence and all about the life of William Wallace. We have found some fascinating facts. We have had a very hardworking and successful first term.

PRIMARY 7S

This term Primary 7 have loved their WW2 topic. They have enjoyed learning about the events of WW2, the key figures, imagining themselves as evacuees, carrying identity cards, completing Air Raid drills and exploring Propaganda. They are looking forward to continuing this after the holidays. Primary 7 have also enjoyed their new P7 responsibilities and buddying the new Primary 1's. They had an amazing time when they were able to visit the Castle for "Diggin' in Dundonald" where they loved participating in digging for and learning about artefacts. A fantastic term for P7 with lots of hard work and they are looking forward to an even more exciting Term 2!

Children in our P5/6 and P7 classes had the opportunity to develop their skills as junior archaeologists by participating in "Diggin' Dundonald" at Dundonald Castle. "Diggin' Dundonald" was led by Dundonald Castle staff and visiting specialists from Historic Environment Scotland. The children engaged in a wide range of 'hands-on' archaeological activities, such as digging, sifting, drawing, note-taking and close observation.
