Last week, Mrs Kerr spent time speaking with each of our classes to find out what they have enjoyed learning this term. Here is what the children said.

| Early Years Class | This term, we have enjoyed investigating the signs of Autumn and Winter, developing our understanding of the seasons. We have also been learning to recognise and express our emotions through creating their own "emotion potions." We have also demonstrated excellent creativity and problemsolving skills in the block area, using 2D shapes and 3D objects to plan, construct, and build. | |

| Primary 1 | Our Primary 1 class has been busy learning and creating! The children enjoyed exploring dinosaurs and had lots of fun making their own fossils. They have worked very hard to complete their initial sounds in literacy and are now confidently beginning to read and write. In maths, the class has been learning about addition and practising adding numbers in fun and hands-on ways. Well done, Primary 1, for your fantastic effort and enthusiasm! | |

PRIMARY 1 REGISTRATION FOR SESSION 2025-26

Registration (for children whose 5th birthday is between 1st March '26 and 28th Feb '27). Families should complete P1 Registration forms online between Mon 12 and Fri 16 Jan 2026. We will send you the link once it is available. You will need your Council Tax Notice and a Utility Bill to complete the form. You can request a Council Tax statement from South Ayrshire by phoning 0300 123 0900 (this usually takes a few weeks to arrive). Utility companies will also provide an electronic/paper statement on request. If you have any questions, please contact the school.

Children who will still be aged 4 when the school term begins in August 2026 have the option to defer their P1 year. If you wish to defer, please complete the P1 deferral form online. You will find this on the same page as the P1 registration form. We will share all the web-links once they are available.
