


Child Protection

PE Kits

Health & Safety - Medication



Please note that children should **NOT** be sent to school with medication in schoolbags. Any requests for children to take medication at school should be discussed with Mrs Stevenson or Mrs Hill via the school office. The necessary paperwork must be completed.



School Meals

Prices for school lunch for the academic year 2020/21 will be £2.15 in primary schools for a two-course lunch or meal deal. Plus, 25p for Milk. In schools there is a three-week menu cycle. There are no alternatives to the menu available but Special diets are available on request and can be provided in all schools. P1-3 are entitled to a free lunch as well as Nursery children however, Nursery children have a set menu. Depending on your financial circumstances, you may still be entitled to free school meals for your child beyond Primary 3. If you feel this is the case please contact the school for the relevant application form.

Drinking Water at School



Fisherton Primary fully supports the Scottish Government's guidance around Healthy eating in schools. We therefore encourage all parents to provide a water bottle as all children have access to drinking water throughout the school day. Some children choose not to drink during class time which is a personal choice and will not be monitored by class teachers.

Choking Guidance for Early Years children

All snacks and lunches should be provided in accordance with the <u>Good practice guidance: prevention</u> and <u>management of choking episodes in babies and children</u> (December 2019). All staff should ensure they are familiar with these guidelines. Raw carrots and popcorn should NOT be provided, Small fruit and vegetables like cherry tomatoes, grapes and blackberries should be quartered (length ways) and large fruits cut into slices rather than chunks. This guidance also applies to packed lunches from home.

Communication

Communication is key to an effective partnership between school and home, and I am grateful to the large number of parents who support this. Where you have a query about your child's learning or behaviour, in the first instance the link would be with the class teacher. However, should you wish to speak to the HT or Principal teacher then please feel free to make an appointment via the school office.

If your child is going to be absent we would appreciate if you could let the school know by calling 01292 612049 In the event of your child becoming ill, or having an accident at school or Nursery, we will contact you or your emergency numbers immediately. Please ensure we have your most recent contact numbers, and let us know ASAP if they change throughout the year.

Harvest Donations

Arrangements for entering the school

To adhere to government guidelines regarding social distancing to minimise the risk of infection to staff, parents/carers and pupils, South Ayrshire Council have asked that we implement the following measures:

- Parents/carers are strongly encouraged to drop children off at the school gates at 9am and not enter the playground. Drop off and pick up is limited to 1 adult per family.
- Parents/carers should not enter the school building unless by prior appointment.
- Visitors are not permitted to the school unless essential and with prior appointment.
- Parents are not permitted to park within the school car park
- Pupils should not arrive at school earlier than 9am unless advised to do so for staggering purposes or via school transport.
- Pupils will apply hand gel when entering the school
