





Dear Parents / Carers,

We got off to a great start this term with our Spooky Sponsored Halloween Walk which has been closely followed by Children in Need fun, and already we have started with the Christmas preparations for crafts and class activities.

COVID update

We regularly update our school risk assessment to take account of the latest Government guidelines. As part of the mitigating procedures to keep your children and staff members safe, all staff must now wear face coverings when moving around the school and in social spaces. When staff are working closely with a child or groups of children, they are also required to wear a face covering. Parents/carers within the playground and near to the school entrances are also required to wear a face covering in addition to maintaining 2 metres distance from each other.

We are also following the latest guidelines on ventilation, and all windows are open in classrooms and the doors are opened during break times to ensure fresh air is being circulated in all class bases.

It has been very challenging for everyone, but the staff and children have been very flexible in adapting to the continual changes as we respond to the latest Government Health advice.

We have had a number of children and families who have had to self-isolate for short periods of time. The teaching staff will post a selection of classwork either on TEAMS (P4-7) or on SEESAW (P1-3) to ensure learning is not disrupted whilst in self isolation. All children in P4-7 are familiar with their log-ins and how to access the site. We appreciate that the younger children are relying on parents/carers to support them, therefore SEESAW is an easier means for parents to communicate with the class teacher and to post completed work on.

Those children who are entitled to a free school meal due to parents being on low incomes, are entitled to receive a payment whilst they are isolating. This does not apply to all P1-3 children who receive free meals through the Government funded initiative. Please contact the school directly if you feel that this applies to you.

Handwashing / Sanitising

We have some free skincare samples including gentle skin wash and moisturising cream. Some parents/carers have discussed with us that their children's skin has become very irritated. These will be left on the table at the front door for parents/carers to help themselves.

Staffing

We have had a small number of staff members who have been absent due to family members having to self-isolate. We are very pleased that so far it has not impacted on the service that we are able to deliver as we have been able to secure supply staff.

Mrs Laurie who works in the EYC and within P1-3, is moving to Southcraig School, following her success at interview a few weeks ago. We will be very sad to see her go as she is a talented and valued member of our team and will be sadly missed by staff and pupils. Mrs Laurie is very passionate about supporting children with learning difficulties and was delighted to have the opportunity to move to Southcraig.

Mrs Wade begins her maternity leave on Monday 30th November and we wish her the very best of luck at this exciting time. We will keep you updated on her new arrival. Miss Grater will be re-joining the infant department to cover for Mrs Wade. Miss Grater worked within the EYC and infant department last year so she knows the children and staff very well and will ensure a smooth handover prior to Mrs Wade's last day on Friday 27th November.

Christmas holiday arrangements

Schools in South-Ayrshire will now close on Tuesday 22nd December instead of Wednesday 23rd December. Wednesday 23rd December will be an in-service day for staff and a closure for pupils. Pupils will finish at 2:30pm on 22nd December 2020 and staff will finish at 2:30pm on 23rd December 2020.

We will send this home to parents/carers so that you can then decide if you wish to purchase any books. There is a great range of books on offer and the school always benefits from the commission on the sales, which we then use to purchase books for our own library.

Cards, Calendars and crafts

Each child has made a Christmas card and this year we are also creating the 'Four Seasons' family calendars where the children will be photographed using props in each of the four backgrounds for each season. Children will be photographed individually or with siblings within the school. These are available for families to order. Each child will also be making some Christmas crafts as gifts for their families. We are also going to run a Christmas Craft Club for P3-7 pupils and we will use the gym and dining hall as it is well ventilated and allows for distancing between class groups. The materials will be provided by the school and the children will be able to sell them within school prior to Christmas.

Activities

We have planned a number of activities for December, whilst still being very mindful of the current restrictions. We feel that it is important that we still try to maintain some normality and have some festive fun. The school will be using some of the sponsor money to pay for Christmas parties, the pantomime and presents.

We are planning to create and share a virtual Christmas Advent Calendar. Each day in December leading up to Christmas, we will share a Christmas activity or performance with parents/carers. This will include Christmas artwork, dance, sketch, story, poem, songs using musical instruments and sign language. This will be posted to facebook, twitter and on our BLOG.

Jumpers

We would like to invite children to start wearing their Christmas Jumpers from **Tuesday** 1st **December** leading up to the Christmas lunch on **Friday 4th December**.
