

# Gardenrose Early Years Centre Newsletter November 2020





## Dear Parents / Carers,

We got off to a great start this term with our Spooky Sponsored Halloween Walk which has been closely followed by Children in Need fun, and already we have started with the Christmas preparations.

#### COVID update

We regularly update our school risk assessment to take account of the latest Government guidelines. As part of the mitigating procedures to keep your children and staff members safe, all staff must now wear face coverings when moving around the school and in social spaces. When staff are working closely with a child or groups of children, they are also required to wear a face covering. Parents/carers within the playground and near to the school entrances are also required to wear a face covering in addition to maintaining 2 metres distance from each other.

We are also following the latest guidelines on ventilation, and all windows are open in and the doors are opened when the children are outdoors, to ensure fresh air is being circulated in all class bases. It has been very challenging for everyone, but the staff and children have been very flexible in adapting to the continual changes as we respond to the latest Government Health advice.

#### Staffing

We have had a small number of staff members who have been absent due to family members having to self-isolate. We are very pleased that so far it has not impacted on the service that we are able to deliver as we have been able to secure supply staff.

Mrs Laurie who works in the EYC and within P1-3, is moving to Southcraig School, following her success at interview a few weeks ago. We will be very sad to see her go as she is a talented and valued member of our team and will be sadly missed by staff and pupils.

#### Christmas holiday arrangements

Schools in South-Ayrshire will now close on Tuesday 22<sup>nd</sup> December instead of Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> December. Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> December will be an in-service day for staff and a closure for pupils. Pupils will finish at 2:30pm on 22<sup>nd</sup> December 2020 and staff will finish at 2:30pm on 23<sup>rd</sup> December 2020.

The Book Fayre has arrived in school and will be with us until 26<sup>th</sup> November. We have attached the pre-browse catalogue which includes payment details. Parents and pupils can browse the full range of books in advance using our new Parent Order Forms. The final page of the PDF is editable so parents/carers can add their selections and email them back to the school. Scholastic would prefer that parents use the 'pay by phone' option rather than cash but we are happy to accept cash if required.

When ordering books parents need the School Customer ID : <u>31500804 Gardenrose</u> <u>Primary School.</u> Parents will then be given a transaction code when they make a phone payment, which you pass onto ourselves as proof of payment.

The children will have the opportunity to come along next week to have a look at the books and while they are browsing the Book Fair, the staff will use the wish list to write down the books that catch their eye. We will send this home to parents/carers so that you can then decide if you wish to purchase any books. There is a great range of books on offer and the school always benefits from the commission on the sales, which we then use to purchase books for our own library.

She can also help you find out more information about how you can support your child's development at home.

#### <u>Snack</u>

Can we remind all parents that we would appreciate £1.50 per week towards snack. This money allows us to provide your child with a variety of healthy fruit and vegetables throughout the week. Your child gets a snack in the morning and afternoon each day but we will struggle to continue to provide this if all parents/carers do not contribute. We are looking into ways for parents to pay monthly or termly using the council system.

#### Forest Schools

We are in the process of implementing a weekly forest school within the school grounds. This will be happening each Wednesday throughout in small groups of 6 and 7.
