


At the end of the week (Friday if possible) Get an adult or big brother/sister to test you with your spelling words.





How can I use adding and subtracting to work out change?

Pounds and pence

Money comes in **pounds** and **pence**. One pound is the same as 100 pence.

Pounds are written with a **£** before the number:


- for example **two pounds** is written as **£2**.

Pence are written with a **p** after the number:

- for example **twenty pence** is written as **20p**

Sometimes pounds and pence are written together as **£** then the **number of pounds** then a **dot** then the **number of pence**.

- for example **one pound and fifty pence** is written as **£1.50**
