Literacy and English

Listening and Talking

This term we will continue to develop our notetaking skills, with a particular focus on the Holocaust. This will tie in with our current IDL work.

Reading

Currently, we are reading 'The Boy in the Striped Pyjamas' by John Boyne and further developing our skills in the use of the 6 Active Literacy strategies. When we have completed the book, we will then move on to group novels.

Writing

Our focus in writing will be a portal story, which will see the class develop their detail and description, as their characters are transported to another world, where they will then need to find their way back from!

Health and Wellbeing

We will shortly begin transition PE sessions at Prestwick Academy (More details to follow). This will give the children the opportunity to become familiar with the facilities available. We will also start our annual Sports' Championship, the content of which will be decided upon by the children.

This term will see us complete the P7 sexual health lessons. We will send out information for about this separately.

Contexts for Learning

We currently have a focus on the Holocaust and will follow this with the remainder of our WW2 work.

In the last few weeks of term, our IDL will be Art and the Visual Flements

Numeracy and Mathematics

This term, we have developed our skills in finding the area and perimeter of compound shapes. Next, we will learn about fractions focussing on finding fractions of amounts, converting between improper fractions and mixed numbers and developing our understanding of adding and subtracting fractions. We will then look at negative numbers and will have experience of solving problems involving integers. Finally, we will cover percentages and making the link between decimals, fractions and percentages.
