Guidance for Parents

We respect the unique set of circumstances and values each family has and home learning is parental choice and will not be 'marked' by teachers. Please do as many or as few tasks listed below.

If your child requires additional support with any learning tasks the class teacher will discuss this with you individually.

Home learning should never be stressful for a family. If you wish to discuss any aspect of your child's learning please do not hesitate to contact us.

Reading

We do strongly encourage that families develop regular reading routines. We recommend 10 - 15 minutes each day. Make it comfortable and enjoyable to develop a love of reading for enjoyment. Books can be read to and with children and audio books are a great way to develop vocabulary and story structure.

Health and Wellbeing

We also encourage wellness. We want children to be safe, healthy, achieving, nurtured, active, respected, responsible and included. We love to hear about any out of school clubs and achievements.

Listening and Talking

Play 20 questions by asking someone you know up to 20 questions to guess who or what they are thinking of. Can you describe an animal, place or person to someone, without saying its name, to allow them to guess what it is?

Readina Guidance

You will be given a book to read for enjoyment to take home. Your class reading book will also be sent home. Please try to read this and talk about the characters, your favourite page, what the main events in the story are or what might happen next. Please remember to put this in your bag every night as we need it to use in class. Thank you.

Writing

- Make a dictionary of wow words you hear at school, home and clubs you attend. Find them in a dictionary to check their meaning.
- Imagine what it would be like to be a caterpillar or tadpole and write a story about your life as an animal.

Numeracy and Mathematics

- Can you use a measuring jug to measure liquids in millilitres and litres?
- Can you measure the weight of items in your house using a scale? Which is the heaviest or the lightest?
- Throw a coin how many times will it land on heads? Now try a die how many times will it land on the same number?
- Practise telling the time using analogue and digital times.

Health and Wellbeing

- Learn to tie your shoelaces and your school tie.
- Go for a walk and look for signs of spring and summer.
- Have you seen any baby animals and where have you seen them?
- Try a new way to relax and talk to your family about why this is helpful.

- Can you look for signs of new life in your garden or close to where you live?
- Can you make a Venn Diagram of animals which are herbivores, carnivores or both?
- Draw a picture of any mini beasts, birds or animals you notice in your garden or nearby.
- Go to the beach, collect items and create a picture on the sand.
