Literacy and English

We will be developing our listening and talking skills through giving and following clear instructions for a range of games. This links with our writing in which we will be creating instructional texts using appropriate organisation and punctuation. This term both classes will be reading 'Charlotte's Web,' focusing on developing our comprehension strategies further. We will continue to cover a range of phonemes, prefixes and spelling rules, decoding and encoding a variety of words.

Numeracy and Maths

We will be exploring multiplication and division strategies and applying these to a range of problems. We will be introducing decimals and exploring fractions and percentages. In addition to this we will be consolidating telling the time and calculating time durations. We would really appreciate if you could practise telling the time on an analogue clock at home.





Health and Wellbeing

Mrs McDermott and Miss Dodds deliver our P.E. on a Tuesday and will be focusing on passing and defending. On a Wednesday we will be looking at target sports and then beginning social dancing. Each month we explore at least one Right of the Child, linking it to other areas of the curriculum. We will also be focusing on Anti-Bullying Week.

Context for Learning

This term we will be exploring light and sound. This will include investigating how the eye and ear work and identifying the different parts. We will be learning some Makaton and continuing music with Mr Hill. We are excited to carry out some experiments related to soundwaves, shadows and optical illusions.

What can we do at home?	
Literacy and English We encourage pupils to read for 20 minutes a night either independently or with an adult. Pupils are welcome to borrow books from school and also have online articles and stories on their Accelerated Reader accounts. Any form of writing is encouraged whether this is a creative story, a diary entry, research on a topic of interest or an informative poster.	Numeracy and Maths Pupils are encouraged to spend at least 30 minutes per week on Sumdog. Top Marks - Hit the Button is a good website for practising multiplication facts. It would be great if you could regularly ask your child the time, using both analogue and digital clocks. Calculate time durations such as drives to the shop or the time it takes to make dinner.
Health and Wellbeing As Road Safety Week begins on November 18 th , pupils are encouraged to reflect on their own road safety knowledge. It would be great if pupils could log in to Road Safety Scotland to find out more.
