#### Numeracy and Maths

This term we will focus our number work on the four operations - Addition, Subtraction, Multiplication and Division. Children will be exposed to a few different strategies for each, allowing them to independently select which one they feel most confident to use, for a variety of different question types. In maths, we will explore data handling, developing our

understanding of different ways we can display data we gather in pictorial form.

Following this, children will focus on their understanding of time, including how to calculate more complex time durations, to allow them to use and interpret timetables and calendars.





#### <u>Health and Wellbeing</u>

We will continue to develop skills in netball for the first few weeks of Term 2 and will then move our attention to volleyball. The children will further develop their control of the ball, as well as their understanding of the rules and positions of play in competitive games.

Through discussion, children will gain an understanding of the human reproductive cycle.

Through Circle Time activities, we will focus on conflict resolution, which will give our children the tools to make better choices and the skills required to make and maintain friendships as they move on to S1.

#### **Context for Learning**

Our initial context for learning in Term 2 will be Black History Month, where we will continue to focus on individuals who have influenced the lives of others. We will then begin our WW2 focus, which will be split across November and January, to include learning about the Holocaust. This term will see P7 engage in their Enterprise IDL, where we will begin our fundraising efforts to purchase out leavers' Hoodies. We will plan a fundraising event, creating items to sell, whilst keeping within a budget. Our Winter Wonderland event will take place for the children in the school in December.

#### Literacy and English

This term, P7 will further develop their understanding of comprehension strategies through the novel 'Divided City'. This book addresses a few themes, including friendship, acceptance and sectarianism. Our Talk for Writing focus will be persuasive writing, where the children will develop their understanding of the skills required to put their point across, while trying to convince the reader of their point of view. Is a Jaffa Cake a biscuit or a cake? Let us persuade you! We will continue to develop our reading fluency and comprehension through guided reading, with the children working together in small groups, on both fiction and non-fiction texts. Children will continue to develop their understanding of phonics through encoding and decoding using the South Ayrshire Reads approach.

Not only is this a fun thing to do but it also develops numeracy skills at the same time.
