OUR CURRICULUM THIS TERM

Literacy and English

This term, each class will continue to develop their comprehension skills using the 6 comprehension strategies, through a variety of different group texts. In Writing, we will be developing our understanding of what we should include when writing an information text, a skill we will use as we move on to S1, as well as developing our reflective writing skills. Our Talking and Listening will be linked to our IDL and school show and will focus on note taking.




Numeracy and Maths

This term, we will explore number sequences including square numbers, triangular numbers, and Fibonacci sequence. We will identify rules to extend a sequence and will apply our knowledge to help us create number patterns. We will then move on to look at money and budgeting which we will explore within the context of our school show, High School Musical. We will also be learning about negative numbers, ideas of chance and uncertainty and symmetry and transformation. We will also be completing a group project exploring the impact of mathematics on our world.

Health and Wellbeing

In Health and Wellbeing, we will take part in Transition Circle Time, during which time we will discuss topics such as change, fears and the practicalities of moving on to S1. For our PE input, we will complete a block of Park Run on a weekly basis during May and will continue to focus on our P7 Sports Championship and our preparation for Sports Day, both of which will see us further developing our skills in a number of track and field events.



Contexts for Learning

Our context for learning this term is our school show, High School Musical. This offers many opportunities for the children to develop and showcase their skills in music, drama, dance, and art. Over the coming weeks, we will be rehearsing hard to ensure that our performances are magical. Don't forget to purchase your tickets!

Home Learning Activities to Deepen Understanding

Literacy and English

We have been working hard in school to develop our reading fluency. Please continue to read at home, as often as you can, as this helps to develop their skills in reading and writing. You can take a book home from the class/school library to help you do this.

Numeracy and Maths

Look for examples of the Fibonacci Sequence in nature. If possible, take a picture of it and get an adult to email it to Miss Davidson. There will a small prize for the best example. Remember to research your group 'Maths and its impact on the world' topic to help you find interesting facts to add to your Powerpoint.

Health and Wellbeing

We will be taking part in a number of transition events over the coming term. In school, we will be taking part in Transition Circle Time to answer questions you may have and help you to prepare for the move to S1. At home, make a list of the questions you may have and bring it into school and we will be able to answer them for you.

Context for Learning

Our children are currently working hard in school rehearsing for our school show, High School Musical. This experience is helping them to develop their skills in listening and talking, performance, choreography and music. Please encourage them to practise their lines and songs at home.
