# Parental Questionnaire – a full analysis will be available next term.

I would like to thank everyone who returned a parental questionnaire form. At Holmston we are committed to self-evaluation, with two of our values being 'honesty' and 'courage'. We will continually strive to improve the service we offer. We appreciate that some people wish to remain anonymous. However, to ensure we can address any concerns, it is helpful to be able to speak personally with parents to talk through any issues. When parents have stated they disagree or strongly disagree with the majority of statements and have not put a name or additional comments it is not possible to follow up and work to improve this.

Developments from your comments and feedback include:

- reviewing the procedures for the infants leaving school
- increasing the number of out of class activities available to P1-3 in the autumn term
- re-designing the school website to further improve communication

All returns will be included in the statistical feedback. I would also like to state that any reflections or comments, either positive or negative, would never result in any form of discrimination against pupils or parents as some of the comments suggest. This would be highly unprofessional and against all of our school values. I hope that we can continue to build the ethos at Holmston based on our school values wherein parents feel they can come into school to discuss any issues, at any time.

The issue of parents parking on the yellow lines has also been raised again. I am shocked that parents still feel they can break the law by parking on the yellow lines. I am in contact again with the local police to see how we can take this forward. Members of staff at the school have no powers of enforcement on road traffic management and have been advised not to approach drivers. The responsibility to park safely, legally and not on the yellow lines lies with the parents. Once again, I would inform those parents who think it is ok to park on the yellow lines at the start or end of the day that it is selfish, dangerous and unacceptable. I would ask those parents to reflect on their actions in light of the following UNCRC article:
