**Lunches**

This is to ensure pupils with allergies and intolerances are kept safe and so that you can monitor what your own child is eating. Please do not send in fizzy juice or energy drinks.

## Uniform

We encourage all our pupils to wear school uniform. At Holmston Primary School, the school uniform consists of:

- A white polo shirt
- A green sweatshirt or cardigan with/without school badge
- Black or grey trousers or skirt / tunic
- Green checked school dress
- White shirt
- School tie
- Blazer (optional)
- P7 green school hoodies
- PE kit – please make sure your child has a PE kit in school. Black/white shorts, plain white tee-shirts (not football shirts) and clear-soled plimsolls/trainers.

Please note jewellery is not permitted in school. The exception to this is stud ear-rings which should be taped up for PE. Now the Christmas Party season is over, can I remind parents that pupils should not wear false nails or nail varnish to school.

Please ensure that your child comes to school with an outer coat suitable for the inclement weather we have at this time of the year. Where possible we will aim to have pupils outside during break and lunch times including during showers. Hats and gloves are advised for this time of year too. Please ensure all items of clothing are named.

## Water Bottles

Please ensure that your child has a named water bottle that they can fill up during the day. These should be filled with water not juice or fizzy drinks. We are no longer able to issue cups to pupils to reduce the use of single-use plastics in school.
