NUMERACY ADVENTURES

I'm thrilled to share that we've been absolutely blown away by the children's engagement with numbers! Our numeracy activities have been a huge hit, focusing on number recognition, counting, and ordering.

We've been making great use of our loose parts for counting exercises. The children have shown remarkable creativity in using these materials to represent and manipulate numbers. Our number logs have also been invaluable for ordering numbers and improving number recognition skills.

To make our math learning even more engaging, we've been enjoying some fantastic songs and games in class. These activities not only reinforce numeracy concepts but also make learning fun and interactive. I have attached the links for you to try at home 😊

To extend this learning beyond the classroom, I encourage you to explore numbers in your everyday environment with your child. Here are some fun ideas to try at home:


- 1. Number Hunt: Look for numbers around your house or outdoors. You might spot them on door numbers, car license plates, or shop signs.

- 3. Counting Toys/items at home: Have your child count their toys, Grapes in a basket or make a number tower using blocks or cubes.

PHONICS PROGRAMME

I'm excited to announce that we will be starting our phonics programme soon. This is a crucial part of your child's early literacy development, focusing on the relationships between letters and sounds. We'll be introducing new sounds regularly, and I'll make sure to keep you informed about our progress. This way, you can support your child's learning at home as well.

Be on the lookout for updates about the new sounds we're learning. Your involvement in practicing these sounds at home can greatly enhance your child's phonics journey!

In addition to our phonics work, I encourage you to keep sharing stories at home together and reading for pleasure. - 3. Labelling: It's crucial that all items of clothing are clearly labelled with your child's name. This includes not only gym kit but also all school clothes, coats, and shoes. Proper labelling will help prevent any mix-ups as the children develop their independence when changing for gym and managing their belongings throughout the school day.

OUTDOOR LEARNING

I'm excited to share that we regularly engage in outdoor learning activities as part of our curriculum. These experiences offer numerous benefits for our children, including:

- Enhanced physical development and health
- Improved cognitive skills and creativity
- Better social skills and teamwork

To ensure your child can fully participate in and enjoy these valuable learning opportunities, please ensure they are appropriately dressed for all weather conditions. It would be extremely helpful if you could provide a pair of wellies that can be left on their pegs for rainy days.

We use Evidence Me as our online learning journal to document your child's progress and achievements. Through this platform, we share observations of your child's learning, providing you with valuable insights into their development and experiences at school.

To set up your child's profile, it's crucial that all consent forms are returned by Monday, 2nd September. This will enable us to begin the process of creating each child's profile and begin sharing their learning journey with you.
