
Primary 2 First Newsletter

The children have made such a wonderful start to their time in Primary 2, they have settled in very well and have been incredibly welcoming and helpful to me as a new member of staff. We have been working on our big, new Primary 2 routines and the children are excelling in this, they really are so mature!

Literacy

In literacy, we have started work on our Talk for Writing text *Handa's Surprise* and have been exploring some of its ideas and themes. This has resulted in lots of learning about African animals and gives a good starting point to think about our creative writing journey. We will be exploring this in depth, with the children having lots of opportunity to design and create their own journey story.

We are recapping our knowledge from P1 in phonics and are quickly moving onto digraphs (for example, ch and sh), which some of the children are already familiar with. We have been identifying the initial sounds of different words in class and this would be a good activity to practice at home. You could also have a go at this game to support some of these sounds.

Numeracy



In numeracy, we have been recapping our learning from Primary 1 and have been continuing our hard work on number concepts. We have been looking at how to read and order different numbers, particularly the 10s numbers. We will be moving on to counting in 2s and 5s as well as ordering numbers to 100 and beyond. We will also practice how to read and write different numbers in words. This online game https://www.topmarks.co.uk/ordering-and-
