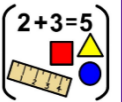

PE: Our PE days are Thursday and Friday. With Miss Taylor we will be covering Dance and Fitness.

Numeracy and Mathematics



Addition and Subtraction – We continue to learn different strategies to support with mental calculations.

Money – We will be recognising and using to at least £2. We will be recording amounts using coins up to the value of £5. We will be 'paying for goods' and calculating change within £10.

Time – We will be reading from calendars and telling the time using quarter to and quarter past. Most children will learn 5-minute intervals.

Angles, Symmetry and Transformation – We will be learning to identify compass points and use positional language. Additionally, will also learn to identify lines of symmetry.

Scottish Myths and Legends (January-February) –

- Discover famous stories about Scottish Myths and Legends including The Loch Ness Monster, Kelpies and Selkies.
- Explore themes such as bravery, kindness, and adventure,
- Develop storytelling through retelling stories, describing characters, and discussing plots and settings.
