



How you can help your child at home

- Read, Read, Read Make use of the Lending Library each week.
- Use home learning phonics books.
- Encourage your child to speak in full sentences.
- Play I spy, Scrabble, sing Jolly Phonics songs.
- Challenge your child to find objects that begin with a certain sound.
- Say Can you find me the m-i-l-k? b-r-ea-d? p-ea-s.
- Find the letter that *pasta*, *sausage*, *eggs* begins with? Say ppp-pasta to emphasise. This doesn't need to be a short word to get them tuned in to initial sounds.
- Can you find the letter that makes this sound?
- Make a word for your child to blend to read (2 or 3 letters). i-n, c-a-t
- Say a word for them to sound out and make —segment.
- Ask them to say the sounds as you point to them.
- Use your homework resources to support learning.
- Practise letter formation.
- Practise writing own first names and then surnames.
- Correct pencil grip Tripod Grasp
